

GENERAL INFORMATION

There are existing platted lots that have their only access off of Rose St. However, there is an existing railroad within the right-of-way of Rose St. S. 13th, S. 12th St., and the unnamed right-of-way to the east of Rose St. use as part of the Original Town Abilene Plat. The right-of-way width of Rose St.varies from 65 ft to 40 ft. have never been improved and are all contained by a single lot. Improvements to these right-of-ways have never been completed. The right-of-way was dedicated for public






