SUBJECT: First reading on an Ordinance for Case No. Z-2010-03, a request from Abilene Griffith Road Apartments, LP, to rezone property from AO (Agricultural Open Space) to RM-2 (Multi Family Residential) zoning, located at 2001 Griffith Rd; and setting a public hearing

for June 24, 2010.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Currently the property is zoned AO and is currently vacant. The property to the northeast is developed with a hotel. There is commercial development across I-20 to the northwest and northeast. To the southwest of the property there is a single family subdivision. There is currently a single family home to the south of the requested property to be rezoned.

The Future Land Use section of the Comprehensive Plan designates this general area as low density residential. This area, at the intersection of I-20 and HWY 351, is also designated as a Major Commercial and Business Center by the Comprehensive Plan. The requested zoning would be compatible with the surrounding uses and the Comprehensive Plan. A concern of City Staff is the condition of Griffith Rd. which is designated as a collector road. As a substandard collector street, this street may not be adequate to accommodate the increased traffic from the proposed development. While staff believes this is an appropriate location for this type of development, the timing may not be right given the condition of surrounding streets.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval, with some reservations due to the current condition of surrounding streets.

BOARD OR COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Planning and Zoning Commission will consider this case June 7, 2010.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, AMENDING CHAPTER 23, SUBPART E, "ZONING," OF THE ABILENE MUNICIPAL CODE, BY CHANGING THE ZONING DISTRICT BOUNDARIES AFFECTING CERTAIN PROPERTIES; CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING; PROVIDING A PENALTY AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

PART 1: That Chapter 23, Subpart E, known as the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Abilene, is hereby amended by changing the zoning district boundaries as set out in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance for all purposes.

PART 2: That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). Each day such violation shall continue or be permitted to continue, shall be deemed a separate offense.

PART 3: That the Planning Director be, and is hereby authorized and directed to change the official Zoning Map of the City of Abilene to correctly reflect the amendments thereto.

SITE CHARACTERISTICS:

The subject parcel totals approximately 5.6 acres out of a larger 56 acre tract and is currently zoned AO (Agricultural Open Space). The parcel is currently vacant and has never been developed. The adjacent properties have AO to the east, west, and south with GC (General Commercial) to the north.

ZONING HISTORY:

The area was annexed in 1964 and zoned AO when it was annexed. In 1998 it was then rezoned to PDD (Planned Development District) as part of a larger PDD zoning district. The property was then rezoned to AO in 2005.

ANALYSIS:

• Current Planning Analysis

Currently the property is zoned AO and is currently vacant. The property to the northeast is developed with a hotel. There is commercial development across I-20 to the northwest and northeast. To the southwest of the property there is a single family subdivision. There is currently a single family home to the south of the requested property to be rezoned.

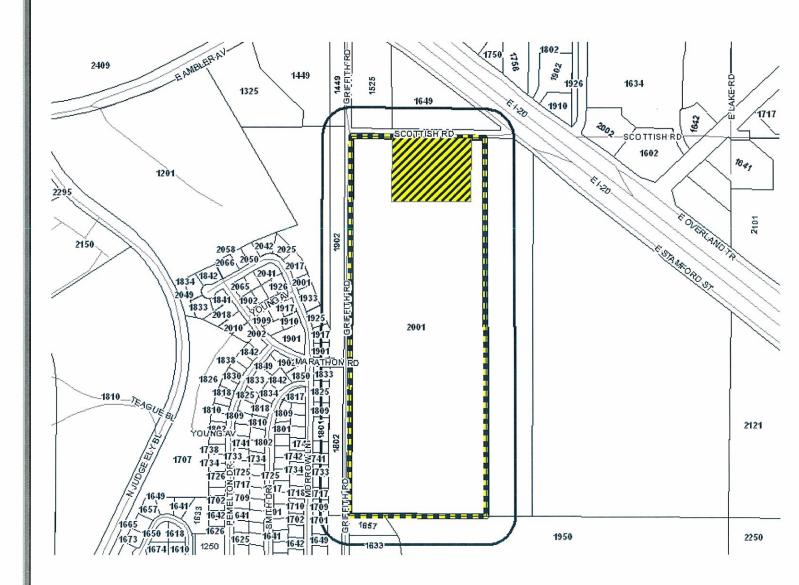

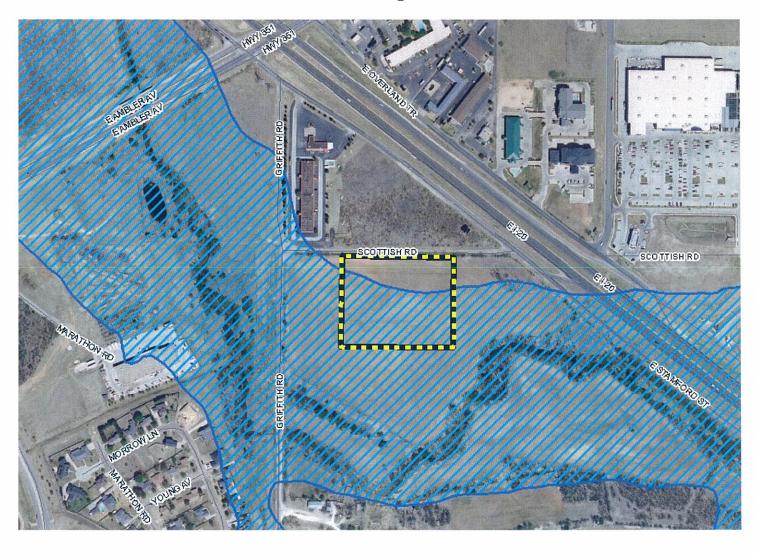








Flood Zone Map

Currently the property is zoned AO and is developed with a commercial structure. The property to the north has been developed with a single family home in HC zoning. The Future Land Use section of the Comprehensive Plan as well as the Southwest Area Land Use Plan (1993) designates this property for commercial uses. 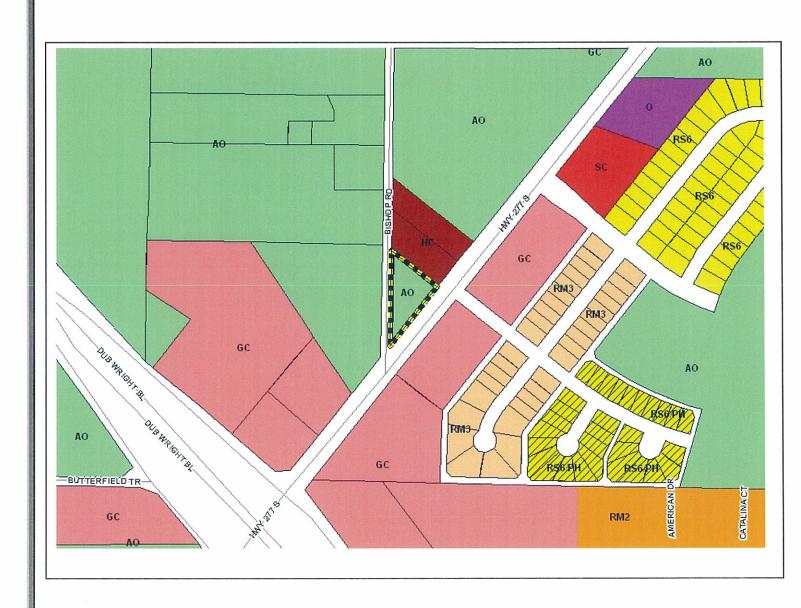

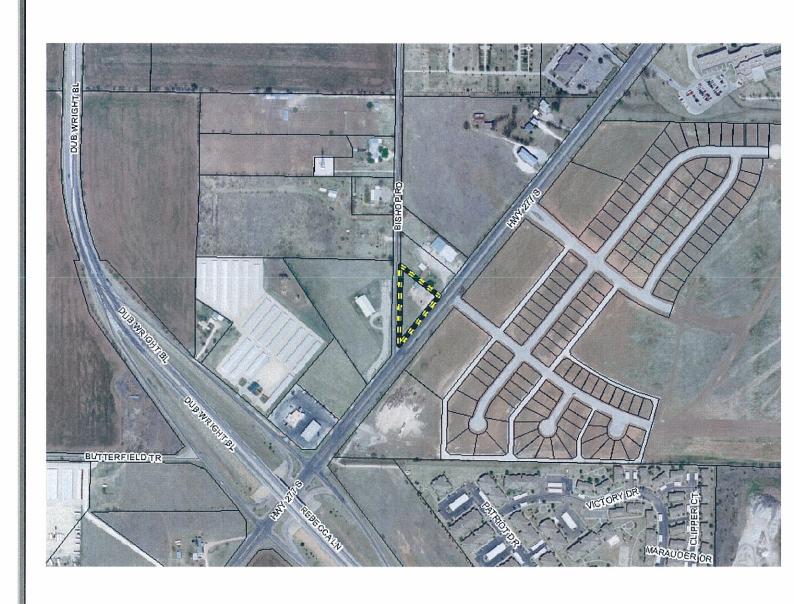

GENERAL INFORMATION

Currently the property is zoned SC and has been developed with a strip center commercial structure. The adjacent property to the north is developed with an apartment complex, as well as the property to the north across Sherry Ln. There are single family neighborhoods bordering the subject property on the south, east, and west. There are commercial developments to the south and west of the property.

The Future Land Use section of the Comprehensive Plan designates this general area as low density residential. The subject property is also along an Enhancement Corridor as defined by the Comprehensive Plan. The applicant is requesting the zone change to allow for the drilling and extraction of oil and natural gas. This use may not be compatible with the surrounding low density residential in the area. Although there are some existing commercial uses to the west and south, this large of a parcel of GC zoning would not be compatible with the surrounding zoning or correspond with the Future Land Use Map. Uses allowed within the General Commercial zoning district could have negative impacts, including aesthetic impacts, that make it less compatible on this particular site along an Enhancement Corridor, particularly such a large area of GC.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends denial, due to the incompatibility of GC zoning at this location in a predominantly residential neighborhood along an Enhancement Corridor. Staff recommends continuation of the existing Shopping Center zoning as more compatible with this area.

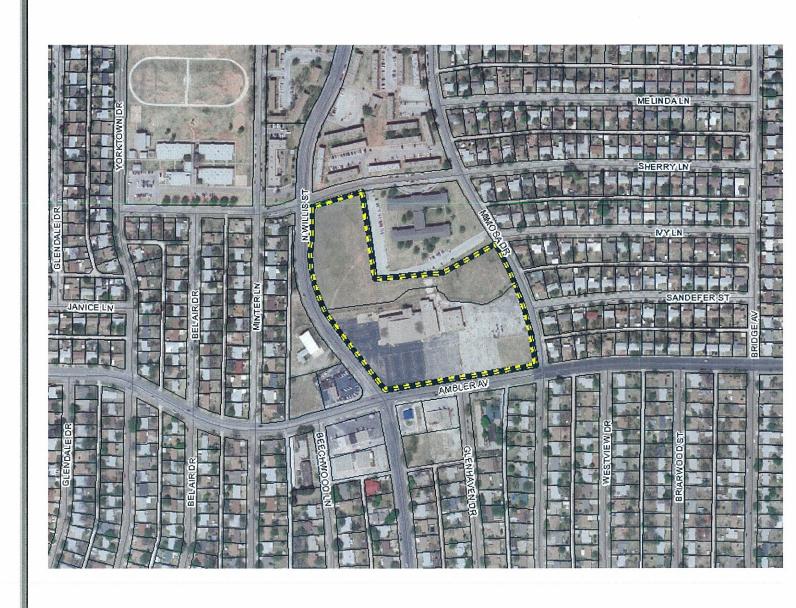

rezone property from LC/COR (Limited Commercial with Corridor Overlay) to PDD/COR (Planned Development District with Corridor Overlay) zoning, located at 5190 Buffalo Gap Rd.;

and setting a public hearing for June 24, 2010.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Currently the property is zoned LC/COR (Limited Commercial with Corridor Overlay) and used as a retail tire store, car wash, and minor automobile repair shop. The LC zoning allows for "Automobile Parts & Supplies (Including Tires)", but auto repair services are not allowed. The property to the south is currently developed with a convenience store, a pizza restaurant, and a liquor store. The properties to the north and west are developed with single-family homes. The requested PDD proposes to allow the auto repair services as permitted uses on the property.

The Site Plan for this site, approved in 1997, made no mention of the auto repair uses. The current use of the property for auto repair is in violation of the zoning ordinance and is subject to enforcement action, which has prompted this rezoning request.

The Future Land Use section of the Comprehensive Plan designates this general area as low density residential. The subject property is also along an Enhancement Corridor as defined by the Comprehensive Plan. Although there are some existing commercial uses to the west and south, this large of a parcel of GC zoning would not be compatible with the surrounding zoning or correspond with the Future Land Use Map. Uses allowed within the General Commercial zoning district could have negative impacts, including aesthetic impacts, that make it less compatible on this particular site along an Enhancement Corridor, particularly such a large area of GC.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

The Future Land Use section of the Comprehensive Plan designates this general area as commercial. The requested PDD zoning can be considered compatible with the Future Land Use Map. The properties to the north and west have been developed with single family residences and the properties to the south are developed with commercial uses. Buffalo Gap Road is designated as an arterial street which serves as a gateway into the City of Abilene. Chimney Rock Road is a collector street that provides connection to Buffalo Gap Road from the residential neighborhoods to the east and west. The intersection is controlled by a traffic signal. The Buffalo Gap Road Corridor Study recommends commercial uses to be located at or near signalized intersections.

BOARD OR COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Planning and Zoning Commission will consider this case June 7, 2010.

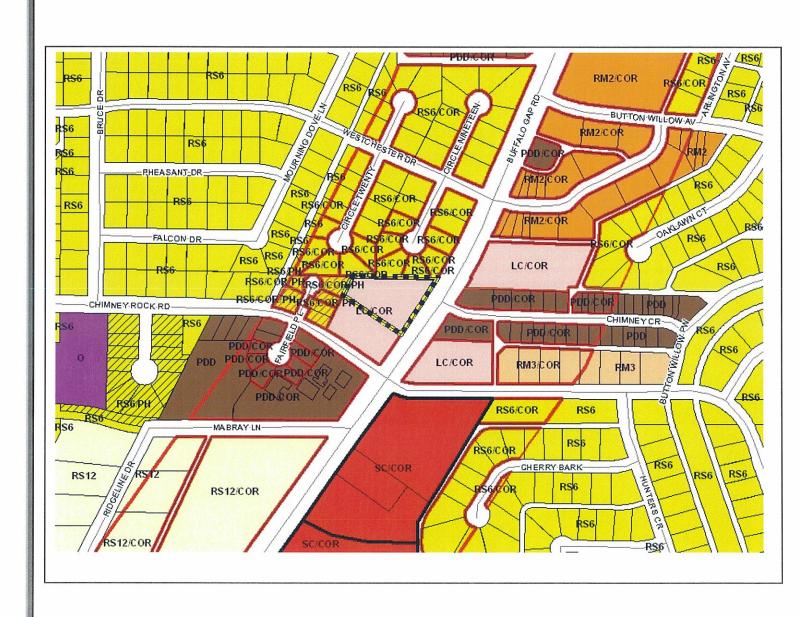

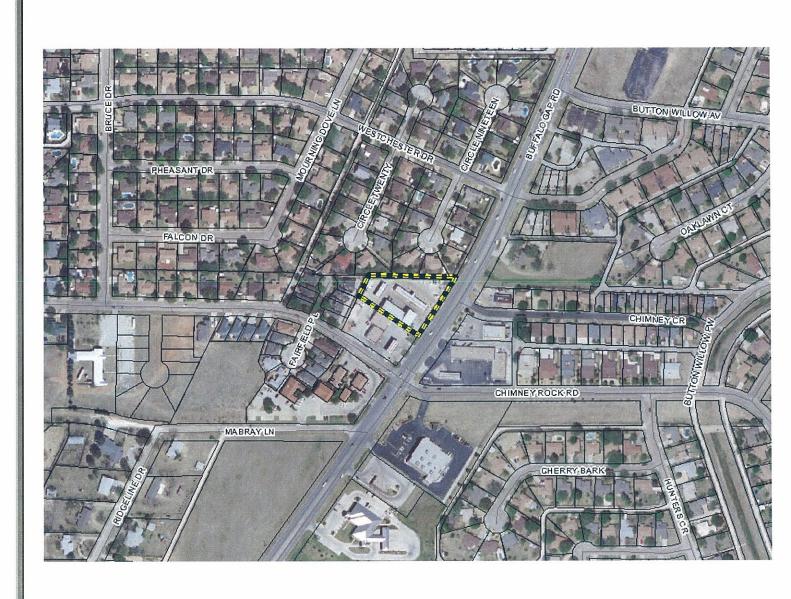

The subject parcel totals approximately 1.0 acre and is currently zoned RS-8/COR (Single Family Residential with Corridor Overlay). The parcel was previously developed with a single family home that has recently been moved. The adjacent properties have RS-8/COR (Single-Family Residential with Corridor Overlay) zoning to the west, north, and south, and PDD/COR (Planned Development District with Corridor Overlay) to the east, which allows for single family residential.

ZONING HISTORY:

The area was annexed in 1963 and zoned RS-8 sometime after it was annexed. The Corridor Overlay was adopted in 2006.

ANALYSIS:

Current Planning Analysis

Currently the property is zoned RS-8/COR (Single Family Residential with Corridor Overlay) and was recently developed with a single family home, which was recently moved. The properties surrounding the subject property have been developed with single family homes.

Comprehensive Planning Analysis

The Future Land Use section of the Comprehensive Plan designates this general area as low density residential. The requested office zoning is compatible with the Buffalo Gap Corridor study which specifically states that residential and office uses are suitable at mid block locations, such as the subject property.

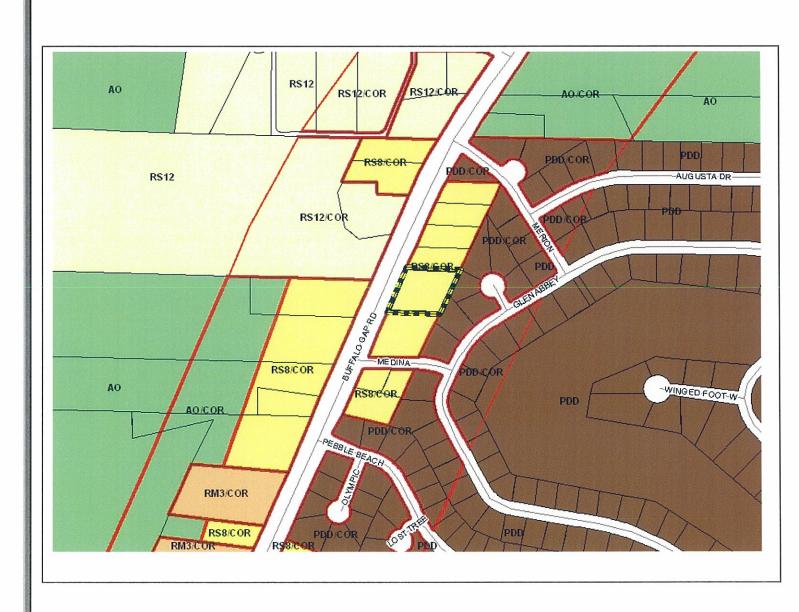

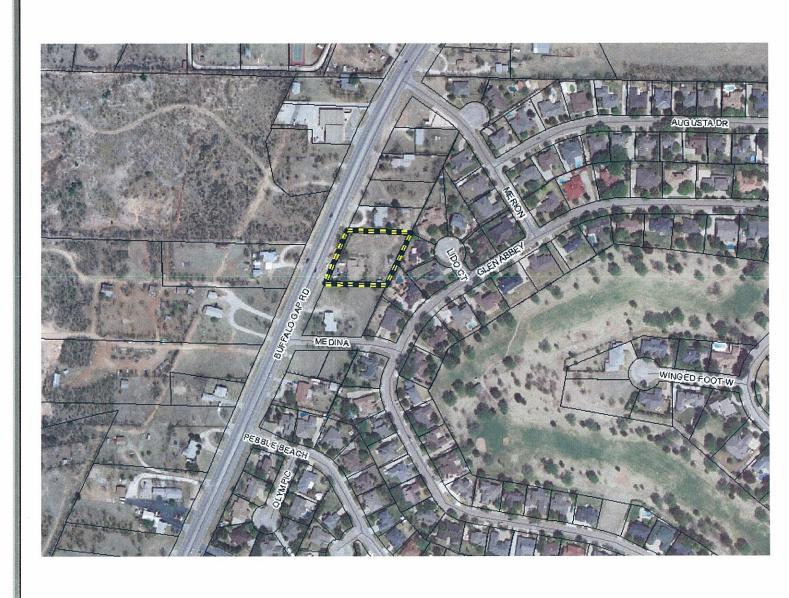

GENERAL INFORMATION

At the Planning & Zoning (P&Z) Commission on May 17, 2010, the Commission asked staff to include an item on the next agenda for potential changes to the Land Development Code (LDC). The P&Z Commission wanted to discuss and recommend changes to the following sections:

Section 2.3.3.4 Historic Overlay (HO) District

Section 2.4.2.1 Land Use Matrix

Section 2.4.3 Requirements Applicable to Specific Land Uses

Section 3.1.1.1 ETJ Subdivision Provisions.

Staff has reviewed the sections and is proposing changes to Section 3.1.1.1 only. Previous discussions resulted in allowing for installation of 'dry lines' in lieu of meeting the City's water provision standards for certain subdivisions in the Extra Territorial Jurisdiction (ETJ). Due to several concerns from the City's Water Department and the Public Works Engineering Department related to 'dry lines', staff is proposing an exemption for plats that qualify as a minor plat. The subdivider will continue to have the option to defer the obligation of meeting the City's water provision standards for other certain plats in the ETJ.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the proposed amendments.

BOARD OR COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Planning and Zoning Commission will hear this item at their June 7, 2010 meeting.

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AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 23, "PLANNING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT," SUBPART B, "LAND DEVELOPMENT CODE," OF THE ABILENE MUNICIPAL CODE, BY AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS AS SET OUT BELOW; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; DECLARING A PENALTY AND CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

- PART 1: That Chapter 23, Subpart B, "Land Development Code," of the Abilene Municipal Code be amended as set out in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance for all purposes.
- PART 2: That if any provision or any section of this ordinance shall be held to be void or unconstitutional, such holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining provisions or sections of this ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- PART 3: That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00). Each day such violation shall continue or be permitted to continue, shall be deemed a separate offense.

PASSED ON FIRST READING this 10th day of June A.D. 2010.

A notice of the time and place, where and when said ordinance would be given a public hearing and considered for final passage, was published in the Abilene Reporter-News, a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Abilene, said publication being on the 19th day of May, 2010, the same being more than fifteen (15) days prior to a public hearing to be held in the Council Chamber of the City Hall in Abilene, Texas, at 8:30 a.m., on the 24th day of June, 2010, to permit the public to be heard prior to final consideration of this ordinance. Said ordinance, being a penal ordinance, becomes effective ten (10) days after its publication in the newspaper, as provided by Section 19 of the Charter of the City of Abilene.

- d) Installation of fire hydrants shall not be required. However, taps shall be provided for future hydrant installation in compliance with City requirements.
- e) An Interim Rural street design, as promulgated by the City Engineer, may be used as an alternative to full City street standards. However, in the following circumstances the City Engineer may require the installation of one or more streets in a proposed subdivision be built to full City standards:
 - i. The subject street(s) is a continuation of an existing street already built to the City of Abilene standards;
 - ii. The subject street(s) are intersected by one or more streets already built to the City of Abilene standards; or,
 - iii. Any part of the proposed subdivision is within an adopted 3-year Annexation Pan, or is within an area where formal annexation proceedings have commenced;
 - iv. Other situations where the City Engineer, with approval of the Planning and Zoning Commission, finds reasonable justification.
- f) In lieu of meeting the City's water provision standards, a proposed subdivision where all lots front on an existing public or private street and are served by a public water supply where existing lines are currently in place may instead provide a separate dry line for future use or may enter into a deferral agreement with the City to provide upgraded lines in the future. A proposed subdivision that qualifies as a minor plat shall be exempt from meeting the City's water provision standards.
- (d) Subdivision Rules. The provisions of this Chapter 3, the standards governing water and wastewater facilities applicable to plats, and the technical standards contained in the Design, Details, and Construction Standards, as adopted by the City Council and as may be amended from time to time, constitute the subdivision rules of the City of Abilene, which apply to applications for plat approval inside City limits and within the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction.

Section 3.1.1.2 Types of Plats Required

- (a) Plats. A Final Plat or a Minor Plat shall be approved prior to any non-exempt land division.
- (b) Development Plats. A Development Plat shall be approved prior to development of any tract or parcel for which no Final Plat is required prior to development of any lot in a subdivision for which dedication of any right-of-way for construction or maintenance of public improvements is required by this Land Development Code. A Development Plat shall be required prior to approval of a manufactured home rental

SUBJECT: Award of Bid No. CB-1030 for Park Improvements

GENERAL INFORMATION

In 2009 the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department entered into a project agreement with the City of Abilene to make improvements to Johnson and Seabee Parks and the North Boat Ramp at Lake Ft. Phantom Hill. The agreement provides matching funds to be used with voter approved bond funds and other City provided funding. The project will include full development of Johnson Park as a multi-use park with paved street and parking, pavilions, playground, public restrooms, beach volleyball court, trails, picnic facilities, landscaping and other amenities. At Seabee Park similar amenities will be provided but on a much smaller scale. The North Boat ramp area will be repaved, the ramp extended and a wave attenuation device installed to provide protection from wind and waves to boaters using the ramp. All improvements are in accord with the Parks Master Plan, Lake Development Plan and specific site development plans developed with the assistance of lake residents and users.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Bids were opened on May 19, 2010. Four bids were received.

FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT

The low base bid and alternates will cost \$1,823,936.95. Funding is available from voter approved bond funds, C.O.'s approved by City Council, matching funds provided by Texas Parks and Wildlife Department grants. The two grants are Texas Outdoor Recreation Program Grant and Boating Access Grant. Those grants total \$831,884.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Halff Associates, the City's architect for this project recommends Award of Bid, base bid and alternates, to Bulldog Constructors of Texas, Inc. Staff concurs with this recommendation

GENERAL INFORMATION

Proposals were solicited for the City of Abilene Printing and Copying services. The contract will provide print/copy services to City departments. Advertisements were published on April 11, 2010 and April 18, 2010 in the Abilene Reporter-News. Requests for proposals were received on May 11, 2010. Thirty (30) invitations were requested with three (3) vendors submitting proposals. Typical jobs included but not limited to: the budget, audit reports, post cards, invitations, newsletters, fliers, posters, brochures, carbon forms, books, forms, business cards, etc... Approximately eight-five percent (85%) of the work is printed in black ink and the finished print on the stock that is 8½" X 11" or smaller. Choice of paper stock, ink, color, bindery, and finish services will be provided as well as cutting, folding, collating, stapling, drilling, padding, and GBC bunch and binding.

SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

Proposals were submitted by R&R Printing and Production, West Tex Printing and Abilene Printing & Stationery Company. The following criteria was used to determine the most advantageous proposal for the City of Abilene; (a) proposer's ability to print and deliver printer material as requested, (b) performance on similar contracts, (c) completeness of the proposal, and (d) price. Abilene Printing & Stationery Company represented the most advantageous proposal for the City of Abilene.

FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT

Funding for the print/copy contract is through the utilization of City divisions. Annual cost is approximately \$120,000. This is based on the volume of printing/copying provided.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the contract be awarded to Abilene Printing & Stationery Company. The contract shall be for a term of one-year from the date the contract is executed. The City reserves the option upon mutual consent to extend the contract for four (4) additional one-year periods.
