SUBJECT: Oral Resolution – Authorizing the City Manager to sign an Agreement between the City of Abilene, Wylie Independent School District (WISD), and the City of Impact to hold a Joint Election in Certain Voting Precincts on May 14, 2011.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Texas Election Code, Chapter 271 authorizes political subdivision of the State of Texas to hold elections jointly in voting precincts if it will be of benefit to the citizens and voters thereof to be served by common polling places and elections are ordered by the authorities of two or more political subdivisions to be held on the same day in all or part of the same territory.

FUNDING AND FISCAL IMPACT

The standard cost for a city election is \$30,731.80. Wylie ISD conducts early voting separate from the City of Abilene and whereas they share only 2 polling locations. The City of Impact shares 1 polling location with the City.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that Council approve by Oral Resolution Authorizing the City Manager to sign an agreement between the City of Abilene, Wylie Independent School District, and the City of Impact.

AGREEMENT BY

THE CITY OF ABILENE, THE CITY OF IMPACT, AND WYLIE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT, TO HOLD A JOINT ELECTION IN CERTAIN VOTING PRECINCTS ON MAY 14, 2011

WHEREAS, the City of Abilene ("CITY") will hold a general election for two City Council positions within the boundaries of the CITY on May 14, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Impact ("IMPACT") will hold a general election for City Council positions within the boundaries of the City of Impact on May 14, 2011; and,

WHEREAS, the Wylie Independent School District ("WISD") will hold a general election on May 14, 2011, for Board of Trustees; and,

WHEREAS, Texas Election Code, Chapter 271, authorizes political subdivisions of the State of Texas to hold elections jointly in voting precincts if it will be of benefit to the citizens and voters thereof to be served by common polling places and elections are ordered by the authorities of two or more political subdivisions to be held on the same day in all or part of the same territory; and,

WHEREAS, Texas Government Code, Chapter 791, authorizes local governments to contract with one another and with agencies of the state for various governmental functions including those in which the contracting parties are mutually interested.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to Chapter 31 of the Texas Election Code, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code and Sections 271.002 and 271.003 of the Texas Election Code, the Joint Election Agreement set forth below is entered into by and between the Entities acting by and through their respective governing bodies, agree as follows:

1. WISD and the CITY will share polling places during an election on May 14, 2011, in the following locations:

Precinct: 306-108

Zion Lutheran Church (Precinct #307 WISD only) 2801 Antilley Road

Precinct: 406-407-408

Thomas Elementary School

1240 Lakeside Drive

2. IMPACT and the CITY will share a polling location during the election on May 14, 2011, in the following location:

Precinct: 204

Sears Park Recreation Ctr. (Impact City Election)

2250 Ambler Ave.

- 3. WISD, IMPACT, and the CITY will use a HAVA compliant voting system (DREs) in each election precinct in which a common election is held.
- 5. The expenses of the joint election will be divided equally between the entities having a common election. Expenses will be determined and divided based on each precinct. Each entity will bear all expenses for equipment and supplies utilized in its election.
- 6. It is agreed that all entities will contract with Taylor County Elections Administrator to provide all election services needed for these elections.
- 7. Early voting for CITY OF IMPACT and the CITY OF ABILENE shall be conducted jointly per the election services contract with Taylor County Elections Administrator in accordance with Title 7 of the Texas Election Code.
- 8. Early voting for WYLIE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT will be conducted by WYLIE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT.

THIS CONTRACT IS ENTERED INTO BETWEEN TAYLOR COUNTY ELECTIONS ADMINISTRATOR, KRISTI ALLYN, HEREINAFTER REFERRED TO AS ADMINISTRATOR, AND THE CITY OF ABILENE, HEREINAFTER REFRRED TO AS CITY, ACTING BY AND THROUGH ITS CITY COUNCIL, PURSUANT TO TEX. ELEC. CODE ANN., SEC. 31.091, WITNESSETH:

- 1. <u>RECITALS.</u> THE ADMINISTRATOR IS THE COUNTY ELECTIONS ADMINISTRATOR OF TAYLOR COUNTY, TEXAS, AND IS THE OFFICER IN CHARGE OF ELECTION DUTIES. THE CITY IS A POLITICAL SUBDIVISION SITUATED PARTIALLY WITHIN TAYLOR COUNTY, TEXAS. THE CITY AND THE ADMINISTRATOR HAVE DETERMINED THAT IT IS IN THE PUBLIC INTEREST OF THE INHABITANTS OF THE CITY THAT THE ADMINISTRATOR FURNISH TO THE CITY CERTAIN ELECTION SERVICES AND EQUIPMENT NEEDED IN CONNECTION WITH THE HOLDING OF THE ELECTION ON MAY 14, 2011. THIS CONTRACTUAL AGREEMENT WILL BE BINDING UPON THE PARTIES WITH REGARD TO THIS ELECTION ONLY. ELECTRONIC VOTING EQUIPMENT IS TO BE USED.
- 2. <u>DUTIES AND SERVICES OF ADMINISTRATOR.</u> THE ADMINISTRATOR SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PERFORMING THE FOLLOWING DUTIES AND SHALL FURNISH THE FOLLOWING SERVICES AND EQUIPMENT:
- (A) PREPARE LIST OF PERSONS TO RECOMMEND FOR APPOINTMENT AS PRESIDING ELECTION JUDGES, ALTERNATE JUDGES, MANAGER OF CENTRAL COUNTING, TABULATION SUPERVISOR, JUDGE OF CENTRAL COUNTING STATION, JUDGE OF EARLY BALLOT BOARD AND ASSISTANTS; RECRUIT AND TRAIN THE JUDGES AND CLERKS; AND CONFIRM JUDGES AND POLLING PLACES.
 - (B) DISTRIBUTE ELECTION SUPPLIES.
- (C) ASSEMBLE AND EDIT LISTS OF REGISTERED VOTERS TO BE USED IN CONDUCTING THE ELECTION, IN CONFORMITY WITH THE BOUNDARIES OF THE CITY AND THE ELECTION PRECINCTS ESTABLISHED FOR THE ELECTION.
- (D) PREPARE AND DISTRIBUTE ELECTION EQUIPMENT, AND ISSUE ELECTION SUPPLIES TO THE PRECINCT JUDGES, WHO SHALL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PICKING UP ELECTION SUPPLIES AND MATERIALS AT THE TIME AND PLACE DETERMINED BY THE ELECTIONS ADMINISTRATOR.
- (E) ARRANGE FOR USE OF A CENTRAL COUNTING STATION AND FOR THE TABULATING PERSONNEL AND EQUIPMENT NEEDED AT THE COUNTING STATION AND PREPARE PROGRAMS AND TEST MATERIALS FOR TABULATION OF THE BALLOTS TO BE USED WITH ELECTRONIC VOTING EQUIPMENT.
- (F) PUBLISH LEGAL NOTICE OF THE DATE, TIME AND PLACE OF THE TESTING OF THE ELECTRONIC TABULATING EQUIPMENT AND CONDUCT SUCH TESTING.
- (G) SUPERVISE THE HANDLING AND DISPOSITION OF ELECTION RETURNS; VOTED BALLOTS; TABULATE UNOFFICIAL RETURNS AND ASSIST IN PREPARING THE TABULATION FOR THE OFFICIAL CANVASS.
 - (H) PROVIDE INFORMATION SERVICES FOR VOTERS AND ELECTION OFFICERS.
- (I) ASSIST IN PROVIDING GENERAL OVERALL SUPERVISION OF THE ELECTION AND PROVIDE ADVISORY SERVICES IN CONNECTION WITH THE DECISIONS TO BE MADE AND ACTIONS TO BE TAKEN BY OFFICERS OF THE CITY WHO ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR HOLDING THE ELECTION.
- (J) PROVIDE TO THE CITY TIMELY CUMULATIVE REPORTS OF THE ELECTION RESULTS AS PRECINCTS ARE TABULATED.
- (K) SUPERVISE THE CONDUCT OF EARLY VOTING IN PERSON AND BY MAIL AND SUPPLY PERSONNEL TO SERVE AS DEPUTY EARLY VOTING CLERKS.
- (L) PROCESS ALL APPLICATIONS FOR EARLY VOTING BALLOTS BY MAIL, INCLUDING THOSE RECEIVED BY THE CITY. CITY SHALL TRANSPORT SUCH REQUESTS ON THE DAY OF RECEIPT TO THE OFFICE OF THE TAYLOR COUNTY ELECTIONS ADMINISTRATOR FOR PROCESSING. PERSONS VOTING BY MAIL WILL SEND THEIR MARKED BALLOTS TO THE OFFICE OF THE TAYLOR COUNTY ELECTIONS ADMINISTRATOR.
- (M) ARRANGE FOR PERSONNEL, PLACE, AND TIME FOR ALL EARLY VOTING BALLOTS (THOSE CAST BY MAIL AND THOSE CAST BY PERSONAL APPEARANCE) TO BE PREPARED FOR TABULATION BY AN EARLY VOTING BALLOT BOARD.

- (N) ARRANGE FOR PERSONNEL AND CONDUCT MANUAL COUNT, IF WAIVER IS NOT OBTAINED BY THE CITY.
 - (O) CONDUCT CANDIDATE DRAWING FOR BALLOT PLACEMENT
- (P) PROVIDE THE SERVICES NECESSARY TO TRANSLATE ANY ELECTION DOCUMENTS INTO SPANISH.
 - (Q) PROCURE, PREPARE, AND PROOF OFFICIAL AND SAMPLE BALLOT PAGES.
- (R) BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PAYMENT TO ALL PARTIES WHO HAVE PROVIDED SERVICES, SUPPLIES AND VOTING LOCATIONS FOR THE ELECTION.
- (S) PROCURE ALL ELECTION SUPPLIES, INCLUDING ELECTION DAY AND EARLY VOTING KITS, JUDGES BOOTH CONTROLLERS, DISABLED ACCESS UNITS AND E-SLATES
- (T) ARRANGE FOR SUPPLIES TO BE DELIVERED TO TAYLOR COUNTY ELECTIONS OFFICE, 400 OAK STREET, SUITE 101, ABILENE, TEXAS 79602.
 - (U) PAY ALL PERSONNEL FROM PAYROLL SHEETS COLLECTED BY ADMINISTRATOR.

3. **DUTIES AND SERVICES OF CITY.** THE CITY SHALL:

- (A) PREPARE APPROPRIATE DOCUMENTS FOR ESTABLISHING THE PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES.
- (B) PREPARE ALL ELECTION ORDERS, WRITS, RESOLUTIONS, NOTICES, AND OTHER PERTINENT DOCUMENTS FOR ADOPTION FOR EXECUTION BY THE APPROPRIATE OFFICER OR BODY, AND TAKE ALL ACTIONS NECESSARY UNDER LAW FOR CALLING THE ELECTION, APPOINT THE PRESIDING JUDGES, ALTERNATE JUDGES, MANAGER OF CENTRAL COUNTING, TABULATION SUPERVISOR, JUDGE OF THE CENTRAL COUNTING STATION, JUDGE OF EARLY BALLOT BOARD AND ASSISTANTS AND OTHER ELECTION OFFICERS, ESTABLISH PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES, HANDLE CONTESTS, CANVASS THE RETURNS AND DECLARE THE RESULTS.
- (C) PREPARE ALL WRITTEN ELECTION NOTICES FOR PUBLISHING IN THE OFFICIAL CITY NEWSPAPER FOR ADMINISTRATOR. CITY SHALL POST WRITTEN NOTICES AT CITY HALL.
- (D) PRIOR TO ELECTION DAY THE CITY WILL PROVIDE TO ADMINISTRATOR THE NAME AND TELEPHONE NUMBER OF AN AGENT TO REPRESENT THE CITY. AGENT TO BE ON CALL TO THE ELECTIONS OFFICE DURING THE HOURS OF THE ELECTION.
- (E) PAY ANY ADDITIONAL COSTS INCURRED BY THE ADMINISTRATOR IF A RECOUNT FOR SAID ELECTION IS REOUIRED, OR THE ELECTION IS CONTESTED IN ANY MANNER.
- (F) PREPARE ANY SUBMISSION OF VOTING CHANGES TO BE SUBMITTED TO THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE UNDER THE FEDERAL VOTING RIGHTS ACT OF 1965, AS AMENDED.
 - (G) APPROVE THE PRINTING OF MAIL AND SAMPLE BALLOT PAGES.
- (H) REQUEST WAIVER FOR MANUAL COUNT, IN ACCORDANCE WITH SEC. 127.201 OF THE TEXAS ELECTION CODE, IF NECESSARY.

4. **PAYMENT OF SERVICES:**

CITY SHALL PAY TOTAL ACTUAL EXPENSES OF THE ELECTION PLUS A 10% ADMINISTRATIVE FEE BASED ON THEIR AGREED SHARE OF THE EXPENSES. PAYMENT FOR SERVICES SHALL BE STATED IN THE ATTACHED EXHIBIT A, INCORPORATED HEREIN FOR ALL PURPOSES. RUNOFF ELECTION SHALL BE TREATED AS A SEPERATE ELECTION.

- (A) IN THE ELECTION ON MAY 14, 2011, COVERED BY THIS AGREEMENT, THE ADMINISTRATOR'S SERVICES SHALL BE AS STATED HEREIN.
- (B) IN THE EVENT OF ANY DISAGREEMENT AMONG SAID PARTIES CONCERNING SAID MECHANICAL AND/OR PROCEDURAL DETAILS OF THE PREPARATION FOR OR CONDUCT OF SAID ELECTION, SUCH DISAGREEMENT OR QUESTION SHALL BE RESOLVED BY FOLLOWING THE METHOD OR PROCEDURE FAVORED BY THE MAJORITY OF SAID PARTIES.
 - (C) PAYMENT FOR SERVICES SHALL BE AS STATED IN THE ATTACHED EXHIBIT A.

- (A) NOTHING CONTAINED IN THS CONTRACT SHALL AUTHORIZE OR PERMIT A CHANGE IN THE OFFICER WITH WHOM, OR THE PLACE AT WHICH, ANY DOCUMENT OR RECORD RELATING TO ELECTION IS TO BE FILED OR ANY OTHER ELECTION FUNCTION PERFORMED AS IS ESTABLISHED BY LAW.
- (B) THE CONTRACTING OFFICER SHALL FILE COPIES OF THIS CONTRACT WITH THE COUNTY TREASURER AND THE COUNTY AUDITOR OF TAYLOR COUNTY.

GENERAL INFORMATION

As part of the Airport's Airport Improvement Program (AIP) projects, Council approved Task Order 21 in October 2010 for URS to design the rehabilitation to Taxiway C and its connecting taxiways. The original fee for this service was \$267,810.74. I am requesting approval of Amendment 1 to this task order in the amount of \$25,521.23 for design of a perimeter road.

Airport staff requested that FAA allow the addition of construction of a portion of perimeter road around the north end of Runway 17R/35L as a runway safety issue. FAA approved this road to be funded under an FY11 grant. In order to have the project ready to bid this spring when FY11 grant funds are anticipated, FAA requested that the City front the design cost of this road under Task Order 21 with URS. The City would be reimbursed for 95% of this cost in an FY11 AIP grant.

FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT

The fee for Task Order 21 is funded through remaining Certificates of Obligation that were issued in 2004. FAA will reimburse the City for 95% of this cost in an FY11 Airport Improvement Grant anticipated by June 2011. The City's ultimate cost of this amendment will be the remaining 5% at \$1,276.06.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that City Council authorize the City Manager to execute Amendment 1 to Task Order 21 of the URS Corp engineering contract.

BOARD OR COMMISSION RECOMMENDATION

The Airport Development Board will consider a recommendation for approval of Amendment 1 to Task Order 21 of the URS Corp contract at its February 9 meeting.



GENERAL INFORMATION City Council adopted the Goals and Objectives pursuant to the preparation of its 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan for Community Planning and Development following public hearings and the receipt of comments on housing and community development needs and funding requests within the City. One of the objectives of the proposed 2010-2014 Consolidated Plan is to increase the availability, financial accessibility, and support for affordable and subsidized rental units.

The developer, Tejas Housing and Development, as Anson Park III, LP, is in the process of applying for tax credits through the HTC Program with TDHCA. The proposed project, Anson Park III, will be located adjacent to the current Anson Park Apartments (144 units) located at 2934 Old Anson Road. The proposed project will be made up of 80 one- and two-bedroom apartments, 76 of them being affordable units, 4 of them being market rate units with 5% designed to be handicap accessible (2 for hearing and vision impaired tenants). Forty-four units will be available to those of 60% median family income, 24 units available to those of 50%, and 8 units available to those of 30% income. A 4,000 sq. ft. clubhouse will be constructed and an existing clubhouse will be converted into an activity center. Project cost estimate is \$10.13 million. Existing infrastructure and public facilities are in place to serve the site. After the award of tax credits, developer will proceed with zoning, platting and site plan, as required by the City of Abilene.

HTC projects are required to provide documentation showing community support of the project. Anson Park III, LP has worked with the Sears Neighborhood Association, in which it will be located, and has received their support.

<u>FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT</u> None. The support stated herein includes neither a request for nor promise of funding of any kind from the City towards the construction or completion of this project.

Authorize expenditure for fabrication and installation of upper bearing assembly at Buck

Creek Screw Pump Station.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The Screw Pump Lift Station is a part of the Buck Creek Pump Station. Two screw pumps in the station lift sewage from the 48inch sewer main into the Buck Creek facilities for screening and grit removal prior to pumping to the Hamby Wastewater Treatment Plant. The 48inch main and Screw Pump lift station were built around 1990. The 48inch pipe was placed deeper than the existing sewer outfalls to eliminate the Will Hair Sewer Lift Station. The screw pumps move a large percentage of the City's sewage. One of the two pumps can handle typical peak daily dry weather flows. Both pumps are needed during wet weather conditions. Failure of the screw pumps would require extensive emergency actions to avoid illegal discharges.

Recent observation by Water Department staff revealed that the Upper Bearing Assembly (UBA) on one of the Screw Pumps was near failure. The UBA transfers rotational torque from the drive unit to the pump barrel while also supporting much of the weight of the inclined pump barrel. The screw pump is a proprietary design owned by Siemens and is therefore a single source purchase. An UBA designed by others would require extensive and costly redesign and reconstruction of drive and support mechanisms. Installation of the UBA requires specialized skills and equipment that is best performed by Siemens. Considering potential negative impacts on public health and safety should the lift station be inundated, an Emergency expenditure was authorized by City Administration in order to initiate fabrication of the UBA to expedite delivery. A contract is being developed with Siemens for the fabrication, delivery, and installation of the new UBA.

FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT

The fabrication and installation of the UBA is an unforeseeable expenditure and would be paid utilizing Water Utility unreserved funds.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

It is recommended that the City Council authorize the expenditure for fabrication and installation of Buck Creek Screw Pump UBA to Siemens Water Technologies Corporation in the amount of \$85,000 as recommended by Water Department Staff, and to authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute all necessary documents related to the contract.
