Item 1 - Call to Order

Dr. Alan Stafford called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m. in the City Hall Basement Conference Room. All board members were present.

Item 2 and 3 - Swearing in of Appointed and Reappointed officers

All 9-1-1 District Board of Managers were sworn in for a two year term with Dr. Alan Stafford serving as board president and Jim Bryan serving as board secretary.

Item 4 - Approval of Board Minutes

A motion was made and seconded to approve September 19, 2014 board minutes.

This was unanimously approved by the board.

Item 5 - Presentation and Acceptance of Annual Audit Ending in September 2014

Finance Director Mindy Patterson gave an Annual Audit presentation for the year ending September 30, 2015. The individual auditor's report was accomplished by Davis Kinard &

Company and found all records in outstanding conformity with accounting principles accepted in the United States.

The next item for review consisted of the 9-1-1 Emergency Communication District Balance sheets, statement of revenues (expenditures and changes in fund balance), and Statement of Revenues (expenditures and changes in fund balance-budget and actual). (Attachment 1)

A motion was made and seconded to approve the presented audit and budget reports. This was unanimously approved by the board.

<u>Item 6-City of Abilene / Taylor County 9-1-1 Request for Police Legal Services (PLS)</u> <u>Reality Based Online Continuing Dispatcher Training</u>

Last year, the board approved funding for Police Legal Services Reality Based online training (see Attachment 2) for The City of Abilene and Taylor County 9-1-1. This service was for online service training dispatchers while minimizing travel costs and registration fees, and helping dispatchers complete dispatcher certification. This renewal cost is for 54 (36 Abilene, 14 Taylor County, and 4 Merkel) subscribers is a total of \$5,400. Since this was a successful program in 2015, the board favorably considered the continuance of the training program funding for the PLS Reality Based Online Training for 2016.

A motion was made and seconded to approve funding for PLS Reality Based Online training service for continuing dispatcher training. This was approved unanimously by the board.

Item 7 - 9-1-1 City of Merkel Funding Request

The City of Merkel requested to continue funding to assist with the cost of dispatching emergency 9-1-1 calls at Merkel City Hall (See Attachment 3.) This funding will assist with the cost of dispatching 9-1-1 calls from Monday through Friday. The amount of the request was \$12,500 to fund service for emergency calls during business hours.

A motion was made and seconded to fund Merkel \$12,500 to fund service for emergency calls during business hours. This was approved unanimously by the board.

<u>Item 8 – Consideration for Continuing to Finance Part-Time Position in Taylor County</u> Sheriff's Office

In 2015, Taylor County Sheriff's Office requested and received \$10,000 from the Emergency Communications District Board of Managers to pay a portion for a part time position. They requested the same amount for 2016. The Board agreed to continue the funding of this position in 2016.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the \$10,000 funding request. This was unanimously approved by the board.

Item 9 – Revised Budget for FY 2015 and Proposed Budget for FY 2016

Mark Hoover presented the proposed revised budget for 2015 (Attachment 4). The FY 2015 original ending budget balance was \$3,460,187 and increased to a revised \$3,917,507. The listed Expenditures showed little or no change than what was anticipated. Revenues were up substantially more than projected, especially the revenues from the 9-1-1 surcharge.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the revised 2015 budget. The Revised 2015 Budget was unanimously approved.

Mark Hoover presented the FY 2016 9-1-1 budget for approval (Attachment 4.) The proposed budget for FY 2016 begins with a balance of \$3,917,507 with total revenues rising to \$2,318,000 and total planned expenditures of \$1,317,298. This leaves a forecasted ending balance of \$4,918,209. Expenditures are similar to previous years with the exception of a few line items. Telephone Services are now \$300,000 because of the amount of extra T-1 lines the city has this year. Other services/Materials and General Fund Services/Charge cost have risen \$7,560 and \$17,193 respectively for 3% raises for our portion of payment for dispatchers.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the FY 2016 Budget. The board approved the FY 2016 Budget.

Item 10 - Setting of the 9-1-1 Emergency Service Fee for FY 2016

Mark Hoover led the discussion of the 9-1-1 service fee for 2016. The fee was recommended to be continued at the same rate as the previous year (6% of the incumbent carrier base rate.)

A motion was made and seconded to approve the 9-1-1 "surcharge" as the same rate as 2015. The motion was unanimously approved by the board.

Item 11 - Adjourn

Board Chairman Dr. Alan Stafford adjourned the meeting at 3:59 p.m.
