18.04.01. Invocation/Quorum/Recognition of Guests

18.04.04. Training Info/Presentation – Trauma Informed Care Overview

Mrs. Goode provided an overview on Trauma Informed Care. BHC applied to participate in a national Learning Community about Trauma Informed Care (TIC) and was accepted. We are working with the National Council for Community Behavioral Healthcare to improve our knowledge and practice related to trauma. The definition of trauma is: intense and overwhelming experiences that involve serious loss, threat or harm to a person's physical and/or emotional well being. These experiences may involve a single traumatic event or may be repeated over many years. TIC is an appreciation

for the high prevalence of traumatic experiences in people. The Four R's: Realizes widespread impact of trauma and understands the potential paths for recovery; Recognizes signs and symptoms of trauma in clients, families, staff and others involved with the system; Respects people by fully integrating knowledge about trauma into policies, procedures, and practices; Sees to actively Resist re-traumatization. The two domains we are focusing on at this time are: Educated and Responsive Workforce and Safe and Secure Environments. All elements of this work need to involve more consumer involvement. All BHC staff have a role to play in becoming and being Trauma Informed!

- Elm Creek Clinic Needs and Capacity Assessment Mrs. Goode reported on the status of Elm Creek Clinic which will provide less services starting in January due to a change with Hendrick Medical Center. Currently, we are looking for a Nurse Practitioner or Physician's Assistant to provide additional services in the clinic.

County Jail Diversion NCA – There were funds available through HB
13 for communities to apply for some funding, which required a 50%
match. We would use money that is used for medications for mental
health clients in jail as our match to provide some enhanced case
management services, if we receive those funds

Community and/or Staff Meetings for the CEO - Mrs. Goode provided a review of the meetings that she and executive staff attended for the month.
