City Manager Ed Seegmiller, City Attorney Harvey Cargill & City Secretary Ruth Hodgin, present.

Invocation by Councilman Scott.

Mayor Howard advised that the Council was going into executive session, pursuant to Section 2E of the Open Meetings 'Act.

After the session, Mayor Howard read a statement that the Council and Mayor had been sued individually and officially by "5" individuals who are represented by West Texas Legal Services, seeking to have the Council elected under single-member district form of government. This is the second lawsuit of this kind filed in the last two years. In this case, the Mayor recommends that we again give the voters a chance to vote on the issue. In that regard, he further stated that the Charter Election should be held in January of 1981.

Councilman Webster moved to direct the City Attorney to begin working on thsi election for January, 1981, and to take appropriate steps to protect and defend the City in this suit, depending upon the results of the election. The motion was seconded by Councilman Scott. The motion carried as follows:
