City Manager Ed Seegmiller, City Attorney Harvey Cargill and City Secretary Ruth Hodgkin, present.

Invocation by Councilman Hilton.

In accordance with the new state regulations, regarding annexations, the City Council was required to hold a public hearing on the site of the 2,460 acre proposed annexation of Quail Valley Subdivision.

Mayor Bowen opened public hearing on the proposed annexation of the Quail Valley Subdivision.

Mr. John R. Thompson, one of the proponents, said that the only residents of the 2,460 acre request were present and did not oppose the annexation. They were Mr. & Mrs. James Meredith & Mrs. & Mrs. Lee Meredith & their daughter, Amanda.


There being no one else present and desiring to be heard, Mayor Bowen closed the public hearing.


