REQ TO ADVvarious, approv€ Mr. Ewing Nelson, Retired Fire Fighter, appeared before the City Council regarding the Firemen's & Policemen's Civil Service sick leave requirement and requested the Council grant him a special request from the current policy to allow him to receive his entire sick leave leave benefit, being more than ninety (90) days. Also, he requested consideration of allowing a scale of sick leave to be paid to persons by means of their years of service. The scale would increase relative to the employees' tenure and would allow for payoff of more than ninety (90) days upon retirement.

Curtis Hawk, Assistant City Manager, responded to the Council in regard to the City's current Personnel Policy and the current Firemens' and Policemen's Civil Service sick leave requirement. The Council discussed the request and whether it would grant the request as a single waiver of the current policy or change the current policy to allow a payoff of sick leave for all civil service personnel and civilian (non-civil service) personnel. The Council also discussed its definition and understanding of the sick leave benefit. Also, the City's liability for sick leave payoff for both civil service and civilian employees and the budget requirements for same. Mayor Hall suggested if a change in the present policy was determined necessary, that such a change be discussed during budget proceedings. No action was taken on Mr. Nelson's request at this time.
