It will result in a more uniform conduction of absentee voting and be more cost effective. She explained some of the major responsibilities of the Elections Administrator and the City Secretary. The term of the contract is from February 1, 1985, to December 31, 1985.

John Hancock, Senior Planner, briefed the Council on an appealed item being a street name change (SNC-285) from Arnold Boulevard to Dub Wright Boulevard between Highway 80 and the main gate of Dyess Air Force Base. The Planning and Zoning Commission recommed approval of the street name change however, the item failed with a vote of three in favor and two opposed. The Plat Review Committee recommends approval, provided that the name change be applied to the entire roadway of F.M. 3438, and not just Arnold Boulevard, between Highway 80 and the main gate of Dyess Air Force Base.

Mayor Stubbeman opened a public hearing for the purpose of considering the aforementioned item and the following persons spoke either in favor of or in opposition to the request:

IN FAVOR:

- . General Pintard Dyer, Dyess Air Force Base.
- . Oliver Howard, 1151 Elmwood Drive.
- . Fred Lee Hughes, 1462 Woodland Trail.

IN OPPOSITION:

- Jerry Smith, Jerry's Campers-118 Arnold Boulevard, expressed concern regarding insufficient representation from the businesses along Arnold Boulevard. He recommended changing the street inside the Base from Arnold Boulevard to Dub Wright Boulevard.
- Larry Yacono, B & L Automotive-609 Arnold Boulevard, feels it would be detrimental to the businesses on Arnold Boulevard.
- Denny Marsalis, Continental Mobile Villa-210 Arnold Boulevard, presented a petition with 800 signatures of the residents and businesses along and around Arnold Boulevard against the name change.

There being no one else present desiring to be heard Mayor Stubbeman closed the public hearing.

Councilman Nixon recommended a compromise to leave the street name Arnold Boulevard from Highway 80 to within the base and change the name of F.M. 3438 from the Dyess gate entrance to Highway 277 to Dub Wright.

Mayor Stubbeman suggested Arnold-Dub Wright Boulevard for an interim period of time to allow the businesses ample time to prepare for the full name change. At some future time, drop the Arnold portion from the name.

Wayne Kurfees, Director of Traffic and Transportation, responded to Councilman Nixon's compromise stating the way it is proposed, there will be a street name making a 90° turn at a signalized intersection and that would be very confusing.

Councilwoman Proctor-Shaw moved approval of the street name change ordinance, on second and final reading, from Arnold Boulevard to Dub Wright Boulevard from Highway 80 to Highway 277 effective upon completion of the extension of F.M. 3438. The motion was seconded by Councilman Fogle and the motion carried:

Mike Hall, Director of Community Services briefed the Council on a proposed golf course contract. The Parks Board Study Group made their recommendation to the Parks and Recreation Board to contract with Golf Enterprises and also that the amount received for the lease each year be place in a "Capital Improvements Fund" for future improvements to Maxwell Golf Course. The Parks and Recreation Board recommends approval of the contract and the lease money to be placed in a Capital Improvements Fund.

Dr. Merlin Morrow, Parks and Recreation Board Member, briefly described the findings of the Study Group and discussed their primary recommendation that Maxwell Golf Course be leased to Golf Enterprises, as per their written proposal.

There were individuals in the audience that desired to speak on the subject and they are as follows:

The Planning & Zoning Commission recommends disapproval of the request by a vote of 3 in favor and 2 opposed. Staff recommends approval provided that lots currently having frontage on the street right-of-way proposed for abandonment are resubdivided, in combination with other land, as to avoid platted lots being left without street frontage. This has already been completed.
