CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS,
CITY COUNCIL CHAMBERS OF CITY HALL

The City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas, met for a Special Council Meeting on January 26, 1989 at 9:00 A.M. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall for the purpose of considering a Resolution relating to issuance of bonds by the Abilene Higher Education Authority, Inc., approving the issuance of such bonds; and the use of the proceeds of such bonds and making certain findings in connection therewith. Mayor Dale E. Ferguson was present and presiding with Councilman Gary D. McCaleb, Councilwoman Betty Ray, Councilmen Walter E. Wheat, Tom Ceniglis, Welton Robinson, and Harold Nixon. Also present were City Manager Jim C. Blagg, Assistant City Manager Roy L. McDaniel, City Attorney Harvey Cargill, Jr., and City Secretary Jo Moore.

Roy McDaniel, Assistant City Manager, briefed the Council on the Resolution relating to the issuance of bonds by the Abilene Higher Education Authority, Inc. Staff recommends approval.

Councilman Ceniglis moved to approve the above-mentioned Resolution, as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Councilman Robinson and the motion carried.

The Resolution is numbered 2-1989 and is captioned as follows:

A RESOLUTION BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, RELATING TO THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS BY THE ABILENE HIGHER EDUCATION AUTHORITY, INC.; APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS AND THE USE OF THE PROCEEDS OF SUCH BONDS; AND MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH.


Mayor Ferguson asked if there were any one present for item 6a, the Sears Park Hearing.


Billy King, Chairman of the Advisory Board of G. V. Daniels Recreation Center, spoke not against Sears Park development, but voiced concerns for the future of the north side, specifically Carver Park and G. V. Daniels Center. Mr. King felt more interest toward Carver Park should be shown.

Mike Hall, Director of Community Services, informed the Council that the gymnasium at Carver Park continues to be placed in the Community Development proposal, but that the State will not consider matching dollars for the gym due to it being an inside facility. Aside from the gym, Carver Park is almost totally developed.

Mayor Ferguson stated this item will be taken up further at today's 6:00 p.m. Council meeting.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:15 a.m.
