The City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas, met in a Pre-Council Work Session on November 16, 1989, at 8:30 A.M. in the Basement Conference Room of City Hall. Mayor Dale E. Ferguson was present and presiding with Councilman Gary D. McCaleb, Councilwoman Betty Ray, Councilmen Tom Ceniglis, Walter E. Wheat, Jimmy McNeil, and Councilwoman Liz Herrera. Also present were City Manager Jim C. Blagg, Assistant City Manager Roy L. McDaniel, City Attorney Harvey Cargill, Jr., City Secretary Jo Moore, Staff Coordinator Debra Guerra, and various members of the City staff.

The Council briefly discussed various consent and regular agenda items. Dwayne Hargeshaimer, Director of Water Utilities, gave a slide presentation on water construction projects. There being no further discussion, the meeting was recessed until 9:00 a.m. for the regular Council Meeting.

Mayor Ferguson reconvened the City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas, into Regular Session November 16, 1989, at 9:00 a.m. in the City Council Chambers of City Hall.

Invocation was given by Councilman Jimmy McNeil.

The minutes of the Pre-Council Session and Regular City Council Meeting held November 2, 1989, stand approved as printed.

Sergeant Finch of the Abilene Police Department and Mayor Ferguson gave special recognition to the RSVP handicap parking enforcement program and its volunteers.

Mayor Ferguson and City Manager Jim Blagg presented a Certificate of Achievement for Excellence in Financial Reporting to Chris Taylor, City Comptroller, on behalf of the Finance Department.

Councilman McNeil moved to approve consent agenda items 5a through 5f, 6a and 6d as recommended by the staff; and approval of first reading of consent agenda items 5g through 5i. Items 6b and 6c were pulled from the consent agenda to be considered separately, at the request of Mr. Joe Perez. The motion was seconded by Councilman Wheat and the motion carried.

AYES: Councilman McCaleb, Councilwoman Ray, Councilmen Ceniglis, Wheat, McNeil, Councilwoman Herrera, and Mayor Ferguson.

6. **Award of Bid:**

- a. North 10th Street improvements from N. Clack Street to Wall Street. The low bid of \$268,667.42 was awarded to Bontke Brothers Construction Company, the most advantageous for the City, as recommended by staff, subject to EDA approval.
- b. Removed from Consent Agenda to be considered separately.
- c. Removed from Consent Agenda to be considered separately.
- d. Partial roofing for Civic Center, Bid #CB005. The low bid of \$33,300.00 was awarded to Lydick Hooks, for areas 1, 2 and 3 of the roof plan, as recommended by staff.

REGULAR AGENDA

Mayor Ferguson opened a public hearing on items 6.b., Wrecker services contract for heavy equipment, Bid #CB008 and 6.c. Wrecker services contract for other than heavy equipment, Bid #CB009. The following individuals spoke regarding the items:

• Joe Perez, J & R Body, understands National is to receive the award of bid. He states Doc Farley, in his opinion, should not be allowed due to his conviction. He stated he has paid his back taxes and feels he's most qualified.

• Lloyd Marr, citizen, feels Abilene's direction toward morality should be upheld. Farley is on probation for conviction of child molesting - he feels Abilene does not need such an employee.

• Luther Marr, 749 Peach, appeared two months ago, paid taxes for Mr. Perez in excess of \$17,000.00. He stated Perez was the low bidder then, did not qualify due to back taxes. He questioned why anyone would recommend awarding a bid to a convicted felon.

• Jon Hanna, 926 Santos, attorney, questioned if Council was obligated by Law to take the lowest bidder, notwithstanding any other facts.

Tommy Stevens, owner of National Body Works, 1637 Delwood, indicated that Joe Perez was a contractor for this service at one time and they had problems with him.

Staff presented the process on considering bids, which includes state law regulation. Ron Pollard, Risk Manager, stated that prior to this bidding, only one contract existed for all vehicles. The large wrecker and small wrecker are now separated into two separate contracts in order to not limit who could bid. The recommended bid for both contracts based on the low bid satisfied City, State, and technical requirements, and staff found no grounds not to recommend National.

City Attorney Harvey Cargill stated he knows of no grounds to reject National's bid, and if National is to be rejected, he recommends rejecting both bids. He knows of no problem with National in his ability to fulfill the wrecker contract. He is the lowest bidder and meets all the requirements as set forth in the bid specifications.

Councilman McCaleb clarified that Mr. Perez was not removed from being eligible; he was eligible to bid and did bid.

Sergeant Keese stated that he is with the traffic division which regulates the wrecker services. Sergeant Keese clarified that the rotation wrecker service for the general public has nothing to do with the bids being considered at this time. He explained the type of vehicles picked up under contract, and stated that although Perez and some other wrecker service operators do or may have incidence reports with the Police Department, the ability to operate the wrecker service in compliance with the contract is all that can be considered.

Councilwoman Ray stated it is not Council's privilege to change the bidding process; Council has to uphold the law. If people in the community wish to change the law, they would have to start that process.

City Manager Blagg stated the lowest responsible bidder is one that meets all requirements as set forth in the bid specifications. He clarified that these contracts are for City vehicles, large buses, etc.; and vehicles where police have made arrests, not for the general public. The general public can specify which wrecker service they desire.

Mr. Blagg stated that the City is bound by state law to take the lowest responsible bid, Mr. Perez was not eligible when his back taxes were owed, and that this is a contractual service and the City cannot discriminate.

Councilman Wheat moved to award the two wrecker service contracts to National Wrecker Service, the low responsible bidder, as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Ray and the motion carried.

AYES: Councilman McCaleb, Councilwoman Ray, Councilmen Ceniglis, Wheat, McNeil, Councilwoman Herrera, and Mayor Ferguson.

a. Cassie Hughes, Building Inspection Administrator, briefed the Council on an Ordinance considered on second and final reading amending Chapter 8, "Construction Regulations," Article VI, "Uniform Codes and Other

Regulations," Division 2, "Building Code", of the Abilene Municipal Code, by adopting the 1988 Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings. The Board of Building Standards and staff recommend approval.

Mayor Ferguson opened a public hearing on the aforementioned request, and there being no one present and desiring to be heard, the public hearing was closed.

Councilman Ceniglis moved to approve the ordinance amendment to adopt the 1988 Uniform Code for the Abatement of Dangerous Buildings, as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Councilman Wheat and the motion carried.

AYES: Councilman McCaleb, Councilwoman Ray, Councilmen Ceniglis, Wheat, McNeil, Councilwoman Herrera, and Mayor Ferguson.

NAYS: None.

The Ordinance is numbered 44-1989 and is captioned as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 8, "CONSTRUCTION REGULATIONS", ARTICLE VI, "UNIFORM CODES AND OTHER REGULATIONS", DIVISION 2, "BUILDING CODE, " OF THE ABILENE MUNICIPAL CODE, BY AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS AS SET OUT BELOW; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING A PENALTY.

b. Cassie Hughes, Building Inspection Administrator, briefed the Council on an Ordinance considered on second and final reading amending Chapter 8, "Construction Regulations," Article VI, "Uniform Codes and Other Regulations," Division 2, "Building Code", of the Abilene Municipal Code, by adopting the 1988 Uniform Housing Code with certain local amendments. Councilman McCaleb moved to approve the ordinance adopting the 1988 Uniform Housing Code with certain local amendments, as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Councilman Wheat and the motion carried.

AYES: Councilman McCaleb, Councilwoman Ray, Councilmen Wheat, Ceniglis, McNeil, Councilwoman Herrera, and Mayor Ferguson.

NAYS: None.

The Ordinance is numbered 45-1989 and is captioned as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 8, "CONSTRUCTION REGULATIONS", ARTICLE VI, "UNIFORM CODES AND OTHER REGULATIONS", DIVISION 2, "BUILDING CODE, " OF THE ABILENE MUNICIPAL CODE, BY AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS AS SET OUT BELOW; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND DECLARING A PENALTY.

c. David Lawrence, Planner, briefed the Council on an Ordinance considered on second and final reading for thoroughfare closure - TC-02689 - Request from Hendrick Medical Center, agent Tim McClarty, for thoroughfare abandonment located on Cedar Street between N. 18th and 19th Streets. The Planning and Zoning Commission and staff recommend approval subject to certain conditions.



Mayor Ferguson opened a public hearing on the aforementioned request, and the following individual spoke in favor of the request:

- Tim McClarty, 1500 Industrial Blvd., agent for the proponent.

There being no one else present and desiring to be heard, the public hearing was closed.

Councilman McNeil moved to approve the ordinance for thoroughfare abandonment on Cedar Street between N. 18th and 19th Streets subject to conditions as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Ray and the motion carried.

AYES: Councilman McCaleb, Councilwoman Ray, Councilmen Wheat, Ceniglis, McNeil, Councilwoman Herrera, and Mayor Ferguson.

NAYS: None.

The Ordinance is numbered 46-1989 and is captioned as follows:

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE ABANDONMENT OF A PORTION OF PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY; PROVIDING FOR THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SUCH ABANDONMENT, AND CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING.

d. Cassie Hughes, Building Inspection Administrator, briefed the Council on a Resolution approving a fee schedule for certain building inspection fees, establishing requirements for liability insurance, and establishing an effective date. The major concerns voiced by contractors were over the \$100,000 liability insurance.

Councilman Ceniglis feels the insurance requirement as outlined will put some good contractors out of business. Most insurance companies don't want to write insurance. He suggested lowering the insurance to \$25,000. He specified a need to insert a statement for the homeowners concerning permits - that no insurance or bonds would be required on their own homes - that responsibility falls on the owner of the permit.

Mayor Ferguson feels the insurance is still going to hurt small businessmen. The following individuals asked to speak regarding the item:

- Jackie Martin, Martin Roofing Company; stated insurance can't protect people.
- C. J. Loza Roofing, 326 Forrest; stated he can't afford insurance.

The staff reviewed for Council information, the purpose of bonds, insurance and permit fees relative to re-roofing.

Councilman McNeil moved to approve the Resolution approving a fee schedule for certain building inspection fees at \$10.00 plus 25 cents per square, and establishing an effective date. No insurance will be required. The motion was seconded by Councilwoman Herrera and the motion carried.

AYES: Councilman McCaleb, Councilman McNeil, Councilwoman Herrera, and Mayor Ferguson.

NAYS: Councilwoman Ray, Councilmen Wheat and Ceniglis.

The Resolution is numbered 64-1989 and is captioned as follows:

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, APPROVING A FEE SCHEDULE FOR CERTAIN BUILDING INSPECTION FEES, AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

Mayor Ferguson recessed the Council into executive session pursuant to Sections 2e and 2g of the Open Meetings Act, and to seek the advice of the City Attorney with respect to pending and contemplated litigation and to consider the appointment and evaluation of public officers.

The Council reconvened from executive session and reported no action taken.

8.b. Councilman Wheat moved to confirm the fall board and commission appointments and reappointments as outlined in Exhibit A attached to these minutes. The motion was seconded by Councilman McCaleb and the motion carried.

Councilman Cenigltis moved to approve the appointment of the Development Corporation of Abilene, Inc. Board of Directors and their respective terms are as follows: William P. (Bill) Wright, Jr. and Joe Davis, 3 years; H. C. Zachry and Joshua Owusu, 2 years; and Dian Owen for one year. The motion was seconded by Councilman McNeil and the motion carried.

AYES: Councilman McCaleb, Councilwoman Ray, Councilmen Wheat, Cenigltis, McNeil, Councilwoman Herrera, and Mayor Ferguson.  
NAYS: None.

Councilman McCaleb made a motion to approve the Resolution authorizing and approving the creation of a Non-Profit Development Corporation pursuant to 5190.6 S4A and an Oral Resolution approving Bylaws of said Corporation. The motion was seconded by Councilman McNeil and the motion carried.

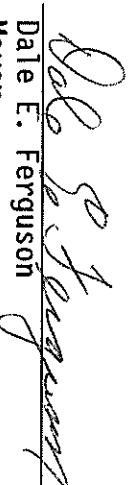
