Staff presented the process on considering bids, which includes state law regulation. Ron Pollard, Risk Manager, stated that prior to this bidding, only one contract existed for all vehicles. The large wrecker and small wrecker are now separated into two separate contracts in order to not limit who could bid. The recommended bid for both contracts based on the low bid satisfied City, State, and technical requirements, and staff found no grounds to recommend National.
