Rev. Leo Scott, 1309 Canterbury Dr., on behalf of the community committee involved with naming the bridge formally requested that the City Council officially designate the bridge as the Dr. Martin Luther King Memorial Bridge.

Mayor McCaleb opened a public hearing on the item and the following individuals spoke in response to the request:

. Myrtle Lee McGee, opposes a bridge being named for Dr. King and does not approve of the location; she prefers a black community.

There being no one else present and desiring to be heard, the public hearing was closed.

Councilman Vasquez moved to approve the Resolution naming the bridge at E. Hwy. 80 and Cedar Creek the "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial Bridge", and requesting Texas Department of Transportation allow a memorial marker and plaque to be placed on the State Highway right-of-way as recommended by staff. The motion was seconded by Councilman Terry and the motion carried.
