The City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas, met in a Pre-Council Work Session on November 2, 1995, at 8:30 A.M. in the Basement Conference Room of City Hall. Mayor Pro Tempore Russell Berry was present and presiding with Councilmen Paul R. Vasquez, A. Don Drennan, Jimmy McNeil, Ray Ferguson, and Councilwoman Kay Alexander. Also present were City Manager Lanny Lambert, Assistant City Manager Roy L. McDaniel, City Attorney Harvey Cargill, Jr., City Secretary Jo Moore, Assistant to the City Manager Debra Guerra, and various members of the City staff. Mayor McCaleb was absent from the Pre-Council Session.

The Council briefly discussed various consent and regular agenda items. Martha Castillo, Abilene Transit General Manager, briefed the Council on item 4.1, purchase of two trolley buses for CityLink. Assistant City Manager Roy McDaniel discussed item 5.3, Resolution electing 1996-97 Board Members for Central Appraisal District of Taylor County, recommending 800 votes for Harold Nixon and 237 for Mike Young, but emphasized the fact that votes can be divided however the Council decides. There being no further discussion, the meeting was recessed until 9:00 a.m. for the regular Council Meeting.

4.1 Request to Advertise

James Condry, Assistant Director of Development Services for Public Works, briefed the Council on the Purchase of two trolley buses for CityLink for a downtown circular route. He then introduced Martha Castillo, General Manager of Abilene Transit, who discussed Federal and State funding, and Sheldon Greene, Chair of the Reinvestment Zone (TIF) downtown parking committee and a member of the Downtown Association, who addressed growth, parking problems, and the fact that trolleys will help alleviate the problem. Mr. Greene then recognized the Downtown Association members present. Staff is recommending approval of authorization to advertise for this purchase.

Following discussion among Council and staff, Councilman Vasquez moved to authorize advertising for the purchase of two trolley busses for CityLink, as recommended by the staff. The motion was seconded by Councilman McNeil and the motion carried.

The motion was seconded by Councilman Vasquez and the motion carried.
