6.1 *First Reading* of an Ordinance Adopting the 2008 National Electrical Code, with Local Amendments, and calling a public hearing for April 23, 2009.

6.2 First Reading on an ordinance to temporarily extend the suspension of enforcement of certain provisions of the Airport Zoning Ordinance of the City of Abilene; and setting a public hearing for April 23, 2009.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS EXTENDING THE TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF ENFORCEMENT OF CERTAIN PROVISIONS OF THE AIRPORT ZONING ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS.

Resolutions:

- **6.3** Council approved the oral Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute Amendment #2 to the Land Lease for Fixed Base Operations for Abilene Aero, Inc. Amendment #2 will lease an additional 20,808 square feet in the area where Abilene Aero proposes to build a new corporate aircraft hangar. This will be at a lease rate of \$.177 per square foot per year and will be subject to the CPI adjustments dictated in the existing lease.
- 6.4 Oral Resolution authorizing the execution of Professional Engineering Services Agreement with Alan Plummer Associates, Inc. to Design Improvements to the Grimes Water Treatment Plant. Recently, evaluations were conducted on five of the eight filters at the Grimes WTP by the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ), Enprotec/Hibbs & Todd and city staff. It was determined that the media does not meet current regulations and contains extraneous material hampering the filters ability to operate effectively. It is not likely the Grimes WTP can operate for an additional ten years without improvements to the filters and continued improvements to the general treatment processes. Filter improvements will likely be the main

improvements needed over the next ten years. Council approved the Professional Engineering Services Agreement with Alan Plummer Associates, Inc. for a not-to-exceed amount of \$331,000 to provide engineering services to prepare contract documents and provide advertising, award and construction services for improvements to the Grimes WTP.

Bid Award:

- **6.5** Emergency Award of Bid for filter repairs at the Grimes Water Treatment Plant. This award will be funded through the Department's CIP (Capital Improvements Program). A Resolution follows this item requesting reimbursement of expenses through the sale of Certificates of Obligation (C.O.). Expenses realized prior to the sale of C.O.'s will be paid from the Department's construction reserves and later reimbursed from debt proceeds. Council awarded the bid to Purcell Contracting Ltd. in the amount of \$506,335.26 for the media replacement and filter-to-waste modifications at the Grimes WTP and authorized the City Manager or his designee to execute all necessary documents related to the contract.
- **6.6** Resolution expressing official intent to reimburse costs of projects for the Water Utility Department. (*Councilman Higgins pulled this item.*)

6.6 Resolution expressing official intent to reimburse costs of projects for the Water Utility Department. (*Councilman Higgins pulled this item*)

Councilman Higgins asked about the relationship of this Resolution to the approved item from the last regular council meeting on the pipeline installation and booster pump station for the Texas State Veteran's Cemetery. Tommy O'Brien Director of Water Utilities addressed this item. This Resolution authorizes the reimbursement of costs associated with the approved item for the pipeline installation and booster pump station for the Texas State Veteran's Cemetery and the associated items on today's agenda in regards to the Grimes Water Treatment Plant.

Council and Staff discussion included: 1) repair of 4 (four) filters at the Grimes WTP; 2) inspection of the filters by the TCEQ (Texas Commission on Environmental Quality); 3) Water Master Plan Study; and 4) the decision has not been made to take Grimes WTP off-line and move all treatment to the Northeast WTP. Staff will be re-looking at the recommendation to move all treatment to the Northeast WTP. Staff will be re-looking at the recommendation to move all treatment to the Northeast Water Treatment Plant; 5) It will take approximately ten years to: (i) prepare the work necessary to confirm that the capacity of the Grimes WTP should be relocated to the Northeast WTP; and (ii) prepare contract documents and construct the necessary improvements. Therefore, it will be necessary to continue to operate and maintain the current Grimes WTP for approximately ten years.

Councilman Higgins made the motion to approve the Resolution expressing official intent to reimburse costs of projects. Councilman Williams seconded the motion, motion carried.
