# CITY COUNCIL MEETING April 23<sup>rd</sup> 2015, at 8:30 a.m.

## CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL

The City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas met in Regular Session on April 23<sup>rd</sup> 2015, at 8:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers, 555 Walnut St. Mayor Archibald was present and presiding with Councilmen Shane Price, Anthony Williams, Jay Hardaway, Kyle McAlister and Steve Savage. Councilman Spano was absent. Also present were Interim City Manager David Vela, City Attorney Dan Santee, City Secretary Danette Dunlap, and various members of the City staff.

Councilman Jay Hardaway gave the invocation.

Mayor Archibald introduced Andrew Smith a 2<sup>nd</sup> grade student at Lee Elementary School. Andrew led the Pledges of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and the State of Texas Flag.

## PROCLAMATION

Mayor Archibald presented the following proclamation

## **DISPOSITION OF MINUTES**

**5.0** Mayor Archibald stated Council has been given the minutes from the April 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> Special Called meetings and the April 9<sup>th</sup> Regular Called Meeting there being no deletions, no additions, and no corrections. Councilman Price made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Councilman Williams seconded the motion, motion carried.

#### **Resolutions**

6.1 <u>**Resolution:**</u> Council authorized the City Manager or Interim City Manager to Negotiate and Execute an Agreement with the Johnson County Special Utility District for the Purchase of Raw Water for the Second Stage Short-Term Drought Strategy.

Due to the continuing drought, the City is implementing its second stage short-term drought strategy. One of the main projects is to deliver raw water from Possum Kingdom Lake (PK) to Abilene. To accomplish this it is necessary for Abilene to temporarily purchase raw water from the Johnson County Special Utility District (JCSUD). JCSUD has the rights to raw water pursuant to a raw water agreement with the Brazos River Authority (BRA). The JCSUD raw water right will be transferred to PK for delivery to Abilene through the use of BRA's existing raw water transmission system, the West Central Texas Municipal Water District's (WCTMWD) existing raw water transmission system, and Abilene's pipeline being constructed to connect the BRA and WCTMWD systems. JCSUD raw water will be treated at Abilene's Roughing Facility being constructed in Breckenridge.

The JCSUD "Temporary Assignment Agreement" provides Abilene with an annual supply of 4,000 Acre-Feet (AF) (approximately 3.6 MGD) of raw water. The anticipated negotiated annual cost for 4,000 AF is approximately \$305,800.

City staff and its consulting engineer are finalizing discussions with other entities for the temporary purchase of additional raw water so at least a total of 14 MGD of raw water will be available. Once discussions have been finalized, then agreements for additional raw water will be prepared and presented to the City Council for consideration. It will also be necessary to enter into a second "Water Transportation Agreement" with BRA for BRA to transport additional water that will be secured. The second Water Transportation Agreement with BRA will be presented to the City Council for consideration.

## FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT

The proposed agreement will require Abilene's annual reimbursement for the purchase of the raw water. This annual cost is considered an operation and maintenance cost which would total approximately \$305,800 to purchase 3.6 MGD annually. Such cost will be included with the Water Department's annual budget.

Resolution <u># 27-2015</u>

**6.2** <u>**Resolution:**</u> Council approved designating First Financial Bank as primary depository and authorized the Interim City Manager to execute the contracts.

In accordance with state law, staff has advertised, and mailed a Request for Proposal to all banks expressing an interest within the City of Abilene, for the purpose of selecting a primary depository for commercial banking services. The contract is to be in effect for a period of five years commencing May 1, 2015 through April 30, 2020. Service cost will be fixed for the length of the contract. Two bids were received.

## SPECIAL CONSIDERATIONS

First Financial Bank is the responsible bidder therefore; Chapter 131 of the Local Government Code places certain restrictions on the designating of depositories. If any member of the City Council owns or

has beneficial interest, individually or collectively, of 10% or less in stock of First Financial Bank or serves as an officer or director of the bank, they must abstain on the voting of the resolution and must not take part in any discussions designating First Financial Bank as the depository.

## FUNDING/FISCAL IMPACT

The tabulation of bids based on current activity for all required services requested and utilized at an estimated annual cost are as follows:

Councilman Savage inquired into the notice that is mailed out to the property owners in the surrounding area. Is the notice specific for the zone case. Jon James Director of Planning and Development Services briefed the council on the fact that they mail out generic letters to property owners, they do not contain specifics of the zone case. Owners in the area are requesting that the council not rezone the property, but the issue before the council is one of amending the current PD for allowance of more units and not a rezone.

## **REGULAR ITEMS**

**7.1** Jon James Director of Planning and Development Services briefed the council on the first reading of a possible action on amending the City's Bike Plan.

The Planning and Zoning Commission and the City Council approved a resolution of support for a grant application to the Texas Department of Transportation for the "US 277 Pedestrian & Bicycle Safety Project". This project will include a pedestrian/bike path along US 277 from Clack Street to Rebecca Lane; sidewalk connections along the southeast side of US 277 from Danville Dr. to Clack St, along the northwest side of US 277 from Danville Dr. to Texas Ave, and along the north side of Texas Ave from US 277 to Corsicana Ave; a bike lane on Texas Ave from US 277 to Dub Wright Blvd.; intersection improvements with pedestrian islands, signal upgrades, and pavement marking improvements; and a portion of the sidewalks along Clack Street connecting to the Elm Creek bridge project. The project will provide safer bicycle and pedestrian connections to Bassetti Elementary School and Clack Middle School and will create a much-improved pedestrian and bicycle network within this area with connections from many apartments and homes to schools and retail areas.

This item is to amend the City's existing 1983 Bicycle Plan to incorporate all elements of this proposed project.

Council and Staff discussion included: 1) whether or not there will be a bicycle lane on both sides – yes; and 2) traffic signals will be the type for the visually impaired.

Mayor Archibald opened the public hearing and there being no one present and desiring to be heard the public hearing was closed.

Councilman Price made the motion to approve the first reading of the Ordinance amending the City's Bike Plan. Councilman Hardaway seconded the motion, motion carried.

#### Issues

- Should we <u>require</u> landscaping during a drought?
- Should we <u>allow</u> landscaping during a drought?
- What do our peer cities do?
- Exception for new landscaping?

**Current Requirements** 

- Stage 1:
  - New lawns allowed additional watering for <u>3 weeks</u> (new residences only)
  - Beyond 3 weeks, normal watering schedule applies
- Stage 2:
  - Same as Stage 1
- Stage 3:
  - All lawn watering is prohibited
  - No new lawns may be installed
- Stage 4:
  - All outdoor watering prohibited

Peer Cities (West Tx)

- Lubbock
  - General exception to establish new landscaping with no time limit (Stage 1 and 2 only)
  - Stage 3 no exceptions for new landscaping
  - Stage 4 no new landscaping allowed
- Midland
  - 30 day exception, can be extended in 30 day increments
- Odessa
  - No exceptions
- San Angelo
  - 28 day exception
- Wichita Falls
  - 30 day exception (Stage 1 & 2 only)
  - Stage 4 & 5 no irrigation allowed; no new landscaping

Why continue to require/allow new landscaping?

- Stormwater
  - Landscape areas prevent soil runoff
  - If new landscaping was deferred, properties would be required to maintain construction runoff controls until landscaping could be installed
- Water quality
  - Landscape areas cool and filter runoff
- Buildings

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- Establishing landscape areas around homes helps prevent foundation issues
- Legal requirements
  - The landscaping ordinance helped during an audit by the EPA regarding stormwater controls

- Practical
  - The amount of additional water used to establish new landscaping is minimal compared to the city's overall water use

Xeriscaping

- While businesses and homes are still allowed to use whatever landscaping they choose, the City's landscaping ordinance encourages low water use plants (xeriscaping)
- A shift to xeriscaping would address many of the concerns that developers and new business owners have with landscaping during a drought
- Other cities with much less rainfall than Abilene have landscaping requirements that result in attractively landscaped developments using these principles

Staff Recommendation

- Increase exception for new landscaping to 30 days, with the option to extend in 2 week increments to allow new landscaping to be established (and apply to both residential and commercial lawns)
- Thereafter, properties would be subject to the normal watering restrictions for each stage
- Stage 4 would continue to prohibit watering and new lawns
- Under Stage 4, landscape ordinance requirements would be deferred
- Xeriscaping:
  - Increase the amount of the required landscape area that can be non-vegetative (rocks, mulch, pavers, etc.)
  - Allow artificial turf in place of grass

Council and Staff discussion included: 1) Xeriscaping; 2) enforcement of water restrictions and citations; and 3) charity car washes.

This item was for discussion only.

# **EXECUTIVE SESSION**

Mayor Archibald recessed the Council into Executive Session at 9:46 a.m. pursuant to Sections 551.071, 551.074, 551.072 and 551.087 of the Open Meetings Act, to seek the advice of the City Attorney with respect to pending and contemplated litigation, to consider the appointment and evaluation of public officers, to consider the purchase, exchange, lease or value of real property, and to discuss contemplated business prospects and or economic development matters.

The Council reconvened in Open Session at 11:13 a.m. and reported no votes or action was taken in Executive Session in regards Personnel Matters Section 551.074, Consultation with Attorney Section 551.071 and Section 551.087 Deliberations about Business Prospects and Economic Development. Councilman Williams left during the executive session.

**10.** <u>**Oral Resolution**</u>: Discussion and possible action related to annual performance evaluations of City Attorney, City Secretary and Municipal Judge.

Mayor Archibald made the motion to adjust the salaries of the City Attorney, City Secretary and Municipal Judge and they will be on file with the city secretary. Councilman McAlister seconded the motion, motion carried.
