The City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas met in Regular Session on May 25th, 2017, at 8:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers, 555 Walnut St. Mayor Pro-tem Shane Price was present and presiding with Councilmen Bruce Kreitler, Weldon Hurt, Kyle McAlister, Steve Savage and Councilwoman Donna Albus. Mayor Norm Archibald was absent. Also present were City Manager Robert Hanna, City Attorney Stanley Smith, City Secretary Danette Dunlap, and various members of the City staff.

- 6.1 Resolution: To approve the donation of a CityLink Bus to Abilene Christian University. Item pulled from consent by Councilman Savage.
- 6.2 Resolution: Denial of AEP Texas Inc.'s application to amend its distribution cost recovery factors to increase distribution rates within the City of Abilene. Item pulled from consent by Councilman Savage.
- 6.3 Resolution: City council approved a negotiated settlement between the Atmos Cities Steering Committee (ACSC) and Atmos Energy Corp., Mid-Tex Division regarding the Company's 2017 Rate Review Mechanism (RRM) filings.

The tariffs attached to the Resolution approve rates that will increase the Company's revenues by \$38.8 million for the Mid-Tex Rate Division, effective for bills rendered on or after June 1, 2017. The monthly residential customer charge will be \$19.60. The consumption charge will be \$0.14 per Ccf. The monthly bill impact for the typical residential customer consuming 46.8 Ccf will be an increase of \$2.04, or about 3.87%. The typical commercial customer will see an increase of \$6.27, or 2.37%.

The ACSC Executive Committee and its designated legal counsel and consultants recommend that all Cities adopt the Resolution with its attachments approving the negotiated rate settlement resolving the 2017 RRM filing, and implementing the rate change.

ITEMS PULLED FROM CONSENT

6.1 **Resolution:** Donation of a CityLink Bus to Abilene Christian University. This is item was pulled from consent by Councilman Savage.

Mayor Pro-tem Price and Councilman McAlister declared a conflict on this item. Mayor Pro-tem Price turned the meeting over to Councilman Savage who will serve as the Presiding Officer for this agenda item.

This is a request from Abilene Christian University (ACU) for a donation of a retired CityLink bus to use for a student-led initiative to bring healthier food options to areas of Abilene where grocery stores are not easily accessible. Students involved in an entrepreneurial group called Enactus have adopted this idea from another university.

Council and Staff discussion included: 1) other past requests from Non-profit organizations and how council has handled them; 2) ACU was looking at a maintenance agreement with the City for the bus maintenance; 3) it is allowable under the law for the city to direct donate to ACU; 4) auction of the bus; and 5) Whitney Harrington with ACU spoke about the Enactus group and their plans for the bus.

Presiding Officer Savage opened a public hearing on this subject and council heard from:

Doug Offermann – who suggested that the city should create a policy on donations

There being no one else present and desiring to the heard the public hearing was closed.

Councilman Kreitler made the motion to authorize the donation of a CityLink Bus to Abilene Christian University. Councilman Hurt seconded the motion, motion failed.

Mayor Pro-tem Price resumed the meeting.

6.2 Resolution: Denial of AEP Texas Inc.'s application to amend its distribution cost recovery factors to increase distribution rates within the City of Abilene. This item was pulled from consent by Councilman Savage.

On April 3, 2017, AEP Texas Inc. ("AEP" or "Company") filed an Application to amend its Distribution Cost Recovery Factor ("DCRF") to Increase Distribution Rates with each of the cities in their service area. In the filing, the Company asserts that it is seeking an increase in distribution revenues of \$28,010,174 (\$21,365,072 for the Central Division and \$6,645,102 for the North Division).

The resolution authorizes the City to join with the Cities Served by AEP ("Cities") to evaluate the filing, determine whether the filing complies with law, and if lawful, to determine what further strategy, including settlement, to pursue.

Council and Staff discussion included: 1) this is the process that AEP goes through for the public process; 2) AEP is regulated by the Public Utility Commission.

Councilman McAlister made the motion to approve the denial of AEP Texas Inc.'s application to amend its Distribution Cost Recovery Factors to increase distribution rates within the City of Abilene. Councilman Kreitler seconded the motion, motion carried.

7.1 Fire Chief Larry Bell briefed the city council on the Resolution authorizing the City Manager to execute a contract with Dailey-Wells Communications for the purchase of the Zetron Alerting System.

A purchase agreement was awarded to Spillman Technologies for a Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management System in 2016. During the Implementation Phase, it was identified that the Abilene Fire Department's Zetron alerting system was incompatible with the new Spillman software. The Zetron Alerting System controls how fire units and stations are tracked, controlled, and dispatched to emergency incidents. It has been determined that the current Zetron system requires a complete upgrade of both hardware and software. The Zetron regional representative is Dailey-Wells Communication. Execution of contract with Dailey-Wells Communications and City of Abilene would allow purchase of upgraded equipment, upgraded software, and installation services in the amount of \$147,247.50.

Council and Staff discussion included: 1) time frame for the software to be up and running is anywhere from 6 to 8 weeks; 2) extended warranty – it is not included in the amount; and 3) discussion of Spillman software.

Councilman Savage made the motion to approve the Resolution that authorizes the City Manager to execute a contract with Dailey-Wells Communications for the purchase of the Zetron Alerting System in the amount of \$147,247.50. Councilman McAlister seconded the motion, motion carried.

7.2 Chris Taylor Assistant Director of Transportation Services briefed the city council on the purchase of two utility trucks from Arrow Ford.

The city conducted a bid (CB-1735) for three different utility truck models. Arrow Ford was the low responsive bidder for Item 1 (3/4-Ton Truck) and Item 3 (1-Ton DRW Truck). Item 1 was bid at \$32,548.00 and will be assigned to Facilities Maintenance and Item 3 was bid at \$39,450.00 and will be assigned to Water Distribution.

Councilman McAlister made the motion to approve the bid award of CB-1735 the purchase of one (1) \(\frac{1}{2} \) ton Utility truck in the amount of \$32,548.00 and a 1-ton DRW Truck in the amount of \$39,450.00 from Arrow Ford. Councilman Savage seconded the motion, motion carried.

7.3 Michael Rice Director of Public Works briefed the city council on the Application/Permit to Drill and/or Operate an Oil and/or Gas well - Schkade Bros. Operating Company: "Hughes Unit #7", Permit No. 818071.

Schkade Bros. Operating Company of Abilene, Texas has submitted an application to drill the "Hughes Unit #7" well on property that they own, located northwest of the intersection of Vogel Avenue and Bridge Avenue. This well is being drilled under the applicant's 167.84 acre "Hughes Unit", comprised of multiple property and mineral interest owners as detailed within the supporting documentation for the permit application. The applicant is requesting a variance per sections 21-26 and 21-27 of Chapter 21 of the City of Abilene Code of Ordinances, Oil and Gas, to drill within 200 feet of an existing building(s) and the applicant has provided the notarized written consent of the property owners of those buildings. The City of Abilene owns no mineral or royalty interest under the streets and alleys within the 167.84 acre pooled unit. This application has been reviewed and approved by City Staff. All owners of real property within 500 feet of the proposed drill site have been notified of this application and of the city council meeting to consider its approval, as required by City ordinance.

Mayor Pro-tem Price opened the public hearing and there being no one present and desiring to be heard the public hearing was closed.
