Michael Rice, Assistant City Manager, presented the item. Adoption of the item would allow the Abilene Regional Medical Center to apply for designation as an Enterprise Zone by the Office of the Governor. Staff clarified City Council approval was the first step, with the State evaluation to follow. The only other known designation was Blue Cross/Blue Shield.

Mayor Williams opened the public hearing. With no speakers coming forward, Mayor Williams closed the public hearing.

Mike Rains, Director of Finance, presented the item. Adoption of the item would authorize the issuance, up to a maximum aggregate face value of \$1,703,000, of certificates of obligation to finance the City's matching portion of the Abilene Youth Sports Authority (AYSA) sports complex at Nelson Park.

Mayor Williams opened the public hearing. The following addressed the city council:

Don Green, Director of Transportation Services, presented the item. Adoption of the item would authorize cumulative purchases for the remainder of this Fiscal Year (September 30, 2018) Mansfield Oil and Petroleum Traders up to \$450,000 each, but cumulatively not exceeding the remaining Unleaded and Diesel budgeted amounts for Fleet and CityLink.

Deputy Mayor Pro-tem Savage moved to approve the item as presented. Councilmember McAlister seconded the motion; motion carried.

Andy Anderson, Interim Director of Public Works, presented the item. Adoption of the item would provide a complete one-way access road from State Hwy 36 to Navajo Tr. Also included in the project would be the relocation of the Airport security fence along the proposed roadway.

Mayor Pro-tem Price moved to approve the item as presented. Councilmember Hurt seconded the motion; motion carried.

Andy Anderson, Interim Director of Public Works, presented the item. Adoption of the item would institute a Street Maintenance Fee and was structured/designed to meet the expectations of the community and City Council. Target date for implementation set for January 1, 2019. City Manager Hanna (1) explained the fee is classified as a utility fee; (2) noted this issue would be discussed with the Street Maintenance Advisory & Appeals Board; and (3) outlined the responsibilities of that board.

At the request of Council Member Kreitler, Mayor Williams polled the audience to see if there were people who wished to address the Council on this issue. Seeing that there were citizens wishing to speak, Council Member Kreitler moved to open a public hearing. Motion seconded by Deputy Mayor Pro-tem Savage.
