CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS COUNCIL CHAMBERS, CITY HALL

The City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas met in Regular Session on July 9, 2020, at 8:30 a.m. in the Council Chambers, 555 Walnut St. Mayor Anthony Williams was present and presiding with Mayor Pro-tem Weldon Hurt, Deputy Mayor Pro-tem Donna Albus and Councilmembers Shane Price, Jack Rentz and Kyle McAlister. Councilmember Travis Craver was absent. Also present were City Manager Robert Hanna, City Attorney Stanley Smith, and Deputy City Secretary Kaitlin Richardson.

Mayor Pro-tem Weldon Hurt delivered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of the United States of America and State of Texas Flag.

Having pulled the item, David Swart stated that now is not the time to spend money on air time. There is no use for parked airports or jets. Mr. Swartz also stated he is for the option of Southwest for a new airline, but not right now now.

- Tim Yandell stated that he had a friend fly from Florida to Abilene and the trip was very expensive. He also spoke about current American Eagle flights.

Having pulled the item, David Swart stated that we should not be spending money on the flooring. The cost for flooring should have been included in the cost of the remodel. Mr. Swart stated that we have already spent too much on the flagpoles, which were \$100,000.

Robert Hanna, City Manager, addressed Mr. Swart's concerns and stated that this is a remodel of an existing building and they are not replacing the floor, but correcting the acoustics in the facility. Staff is having a hard time assisting clients with the echo throughout the facility. When remodeling a facility you do not know what problems will arise.

Darla Mays - stated that she is not for this item and we shouldn't be spending money on flooring right now. This money should be set aside for something else the community needs.

- Rosten Callerman stated his excitement about this item because it entails infield development, and that he is in support of it.

Misty Mayo, CEO of the Development Corporation of Abilene, and Doug Peters, President of the Abilene Industrial Foundation, presented a new partnership between the DCOA and the AIF.

- David Swart stated his appreciation of the presentation. He had a conversation with a team member of a supermarket chain located in Abilene and this employee stated that Abilene is not a priority for a second location. Mr. Swart stated this supermarket was in no hurry to open a new location even though they have purchased a property.
- Sheria Ford-Davis stated she would like to see this move forward, but would also remind staff to not forget about the public with disabilities.
- Chloe Roberts questioned if the DCOA coordinates with the Black Chamber of Commerce and with other minority groups.
- Demetrius Earthly questioned what the requirements are to be approved for this.

With no other speakers coming forward, the public hearing was closed.

Ms. Mayo addressed the publics concerns and stated that Mr. Peters has a great relationship with the Black Chamber of Commerce and the Hispanic Community. Ms. Mayo also stated that the chamber is in negotiations with local businesses and minority funds and they are moving as quickly as they can to assist.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mayor Williams opened the public comment period. The following addressed the city council:

- David Swart wanted to remind everyone of the dangerous weather conditions approaching. Mr. Swart
 stated that he did not receive a notice of when his water meter was replaced and specifically requested to be
 notified. His taps were winterized and had concerns about the billing process.
- Sheria Ford-Davis stated that she had concerns with the accessibility to the restrooms at Stevenson Park. It needs to be ADA compliant.
- Chris Daughtery stated that Stevenson Park needs to be revitalized, as the conditions of the restrooms are terrible.
- Nick Moses stated that Stevenson Park is below average and the restrooms are outdated. He stated his
 mother had to leave the park to use the restrooms, due to the conditions.
- Shawnte Fleming wanted to thank Mr. Hanna, Lesli Andrews and Richard Rodgers for their assistance
 with the conditions at Stevenson Park. Ms. Fleming stated she fell on the chainlink fence at Stevenson Park.
 Also that the restrooms are dirty and there are no water fountains. She is promoting a clean city and more
 quality of life projects and she needs help to get this done. Ms.
- Tanell Smith- Blackmen stated that restrooms in a park are a key factor in someone revisiting the park. She stated she is an AISD teacher and takes her students on field trips and would love to visit this park, but cannot because of the condition.
- Demetrius Earthly stated that he grew up here and that GV Daniels and Stevenson Park looks the same as
 it did back when he was young. He is hoping for improvements.
- Jermaine Well stated that this is his hometown and that the park is in terrible condition. He thinks that if
 you don't have dignity in where you live, you're not inclined to do well for yourself. Mr. Well stated that

kids are currently stuck in houses with nothing to do, but to be on the internet and we need to help change that with a park revitalization.

With no other speakers coming forward, the public comment period was closed.
