- 1) In regard to the bond sidewalk program, the Council asks that the City give particular attention to the Target Neighborhoods of Carver, Sears and North Sayles areas when determining the locations.
- 2) In regard to funding programs and services, the Council asks that the City be more supportive of the programs and services that help productive citizens and those that assist people to become productive citizens. Council asked that staff seek ways to incorporate self-help requirements into programs (i.e. homeowner sweat equity and "how-to-fix-it" home repair education).
- 3) In regard to future funding, the Council asks that the City continue to encourage Abilene's non-profit organizations that help citizens become productive (such as Faith Works).
