AN ORDINANCE CLOSING, VACATING AND ABANDONING A PORTION OF CHINA STREET AND A PORTION OF AN ALLEY RUNNING NORTH AND SOUTH ACROSS LEWIS! SUB-DIVISION OF LOT 4, BLOCK 190, CITY OF ABILENE, TAYLOR COUNTY, TEXAS AND ORDERING A PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE FINAL PASSAGE THEREOF.

WHEREAS Western Cottonoil Company, a corporation, is the owner of Lots 7, 8, 15, 16, and 29 of Lewis' Sub-Division of Lot 4, Block 190, City of Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, and

WHEREAS Western Cottonoil Company desires to close and put under fence that portion of China Street lying immediately East of said Lot 29 and immediately West of said Lot 16, and to also close and put under fence that portion of the alley running North and South across said Sub-Division which lies immediately West of said Lots 7 and 8 and immediately East of said Lots 15 and 16, and

WHEREAS it appears that the closing of said street and alley will be beneficial to the public interest, that the closing thereof is necessary in order that said property may be put to its best use and that the closing and vacating of said street and alley will not cause undue hardship upon the public using the same as a passageway,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ABILENE:

described portion of said alley wunning across said Sub-Division be and the same is hereby closed, vacated and abandoned as a public street and alleyway and that the title to same shall upon final passage hereof shall revert to the abutting property owners as provided by law. However, there is hereby reserved unto the City of Abilene an easement over, across and under said alleyway for the purpose of laying, constructing and maintaing necessary water and sewer lines, together with all rights of ingress and egress and by the acceptance of said property, Western Cottonoil Company agrees not to construct any building or other obstruction over the existing sewer line in said alley without the prior consent and agreement of the said Board of Commissioners.

Passed on first reading the Aday of October, A.D. 1949.

After said passage, a notice of the time and place when and where said ordinance would be given a public hearing and considered for final passage, was published in the Abilene Reporter-News, a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Abilene, the first publication being at least one week prior to the time advertised. After such opportunity for the public to be heard, said ordinance was passed on its second and final reading on the 26 th day of October, A.D. 1949.
