

ORDINANCENO. 339

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING SECTION A,
ELMWOOD WEST ADDITION, AND ADJOIN-
ING STREETS, AND ESTABLISHING A
ZONING DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, a petition has been presented by the owner of all of Section A, Elmwood West Addition to the City of Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, requesting that said territory be annexed to the City of Abilene, and

WHEREAS it appears that said territory adjoins and is contiguous to the corporate limits of said city, and

WHEREAS the map or plat of said territory hereby annexed has been approved by the Planning Commission of the City of Abilene and the Board of Commissioners of said city in accordance with the provisions of Article 974a, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas, 1925, as amended.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ABILENE;

THAT Section A of Elmwood West Addition to the City of Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, together with all streets and alleys shown on the official map or plat of said Section A, be and is hereby annexed to and included within the territory of the City of Abilene, said territory hereby annexed being described by metes and bounds as follows:

9.31 acres of land out of part of John Tumlinson Survey No. 36, Taylor County, Texas:

BEGINNING at a stake set in the S.B.L. of the John Tumlinson Survey No. 36, 985 feet west of its Southeast corner for the southeast and beginning corner of this tract;

THENCE West with the S.B.L. of said Tumlinson Survey No. 36, 866.7 feet to a stake set in its S.B.L. for the southwest corner of this tract;

THENCE North 468 feet to a stake set in the N.B.L. of south 7th street for the northwest corner of this tract;

THENCE East with the N.B.L. of south 7th street 866.7 feet to a stake set for the northeast corner of this tract;

THENCE South 467 feet to the place of beginning.

Said territory is zoned in accordance with the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Abilene of 1946, and said territory is hereby placed in Zone "A" as the same is defined in said ordinance.


PASSED ON ITS FIRST READING this 6th day of January, A.D.1950.

After said passage, a notice of the time and place when and where said ordinance would be given a public hearing and considered for final passage was published in the Abilene Reporter-News, a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Abilene, the first publication being at least one week prior to the time advertised.

After such opportunity for the public to be heard, said ordinance was PASSED ON ITS SECOND AND FINAL READING ON THE 20th day of January, A.D. 1950.
