

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, CHANGING THE NAME OF A STREET RUNNING FROM SOUTH 11TH STREET TO BERRY LANE, PRESENTLY NAMED McCARTY STREET ON THE NORTH END AND MCGOWEN STREET ON THE SOUTH END, TO LYTLE ACRES. DRIVE.

WHEREAS, a certain street in the southeast part of the City of Abilene, running from South 11th Street to Berry Lane is presently designated by two names, McCarty Street on the northern end of said street, and McGowen Street on the southern end of said street; and,

WHEREAS, there is no break or curve in the street to distinguish between the two portions so named, and it is the desire of the residents of said street that the street be given one name, such desire evidenced by a petition filed with the City Secretary; and,

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council that such street should be re-named; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE,

TEXAS:

Section 1: That the name of that street between South 11th and Berry Lane, presently designated McCarty Street on the northern end and McGowen Street on the southern end, be, and is hereby, changed to Lytle Acres. Drive.

Section 2: That the City Engineer be, and he is hereby, authorized and directed to change his maps, plats and records to indicate such change of name.

Section 3: That the City Planning Department be, and is hereby, authorized and directed to change its maps, plats and records to reflect such change of name, and further that the City Planning Department shall provide such notice of change to any other City department, including the Fire and Police Departments, affected by such change.

Section 4: That upon passage of this ordinance on first reading, the City Secretary be, and she is hereby, authorized and directed to cause to have published in the Abilene Reporter-News, a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Abilene, Texas, a notice of a public hearing to be held in the Council Chamber at the City Hall

in Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, at 8:30 a. m., on the 27th day of February,
A. D. 1964, to permit the public to be heard prior to consideration of this ordinance
on second and final reading, said publication to be made more than one week prior to
the time designated for the public hearing.

PASSED ON FIRST READING this 13th day of February, A. D. 1964.

After passage a notice of the time and place, where and when said ordinance
would be given a public hearing and considered for final passage was published in the
Abilene Reporter-News, a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Abilene,
said publication being on the 17th day of February, A. D. 1964, the same
being more than one week prior to the time designated for said hearing. After such
opportunity for the public to be heard, said ordinance was passed on its second and
final reading.
