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ORDINANCE NO. 1027

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR THE ABANDONMENT OF AN ALLEY IN THE 1000 BLOCK OF NORTH 18TH STREET; PROVIDING FOR THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SUCH ABANDONMENT, AND CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Abilene has, at the request of WPH Properties, agent, James D. Webster, M.D., recommended to the City Council that a certain alley, as hereinafter described, in the City of Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, which is neither needed nor used for public purposes, be closed and abandoned; and,

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council that such abandonment is in the public interest of the City of Abilene; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

PART 1: That the following described alley within the City of Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, be, and the same is hereby abandoned, vacated and closed insofar as the right, title and easement of the public are concerned:

Being the 18' alley extending north from N. 18th St. to a point 20' north of the northeast corner of Lot 6, Swenson Subdivision where said alley becomes 20' in width thence in a westerly direction a distance of 206.8' thence in a southerly direction a distance of 200' to its ending at North 18th St., and located in the 1000 Block of N. 18th St.

Said abandonment being subject to WPH Properties relocating present utilities and paying for same.

PART 2: That it is in the public interest of the City of Abilene to so abandon said above described alley.

PART 3: That the abandonment provided for herein shall extend only to the public right, title and easement in and to the tracts of land described in Part 1 of this Ordinance, and shall be construed only to that interest the governing body of the City of Abilene may legally and lawfully abandon.

PART 4: That, upon final passage hereof, the City Secretary be, and she is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance, and file it in the Deed Records of Taylor County, Texas.

PASSED ON FIRST READING, this the 12th day of January, A.D. 1978.

After said passage, a Notice of the time and place, where and when said Ordinance would be given a public hearing and considered for final passage, was published in the Abilene Reporter-News, a daily newspaper, of general circulation in the City of Abilene, said publication being on the 1 day of January, 1978, the same being more than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time designated for said hearing. After such opportunity for the public to be heard, said Ordinance was passed on second and final reading.

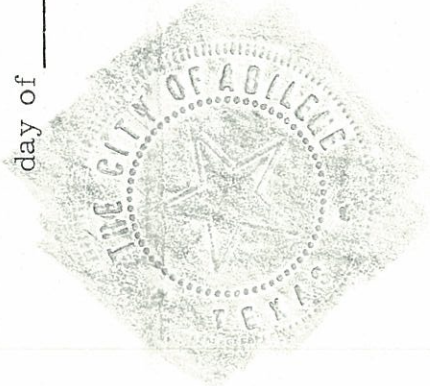
