

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, PROVIDING FOR THE ABANDONMENT OF AN ALLEY IN THE SCOTT INDUSTRIAL ADDITION; PROVIDING FOR THE TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SUCH ABANDONMENT, AND CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Abilene has, at the request of Jordan Wood, recommended to the City Council that a certain alley, as hereinafter described, in the City of Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, which is neither needed, nor used, for public purposes, be closed and abandoned; and,

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council that such abandonment is in the public interest of the City of Abilene; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

PART 1: That the following described alley within the City of Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, be, and the same is hereby abandoned, vacated and closed insofar as the right, title and easement of the public are concerned:

Being a 15' alley 200' north of McGee Drive extending east from S. Treadaway for a distance of approximately 1250', lying parallel and adjacent to Lots 1 thru 21, Blk. 1, Scott Industrial Addition, Abilene, Taylor County, Texas.

Excepting and reserving unto the public a 15' easement for any and all utility purposes along said right-of-way so abandoned with the further restriction that no permanent structures will be placed on said easement.

PART 2: That it is in the public interest of the City of Abilene to so abandon said above described alley.

PART 3: That the abandonment provided for herein shall extend only to the public right, title and easement in and to the tracts of land described in Part 1 of this Ordinance, and shall be construed only to that interest the governing body of the City of Abilene may legally and lawfully abandon.

PART 4: That, upon final passage hereof, the City Secretary be, and she is hereby authorized and directed to certify a copy of this Ordinance, and file it in the Deed Records of Taylor County, Texas.

PASSED ON FIRST READING, this the 6th day of December, A.D. 1979.

After said passage, a Notice of the time and place, where and when said Ordinance would be given a public hearing and considered for final passage, was published in the Abilene Reporter-News, a daily newspaper, of general circulation in the City of Abilene, said publication being on the 2nd day of December, 1979, the same being more than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time designated for said hearing. After such opportunity for the public to be heard, said Ordinance was passed on second and final reading.

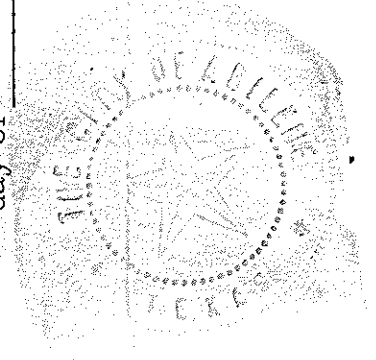
