Smith, Judge of Corporation Court, City of Abilene, Texas, having served the City of Abilene, Texas, as Assistant City Attorney from March 23, 1962, until April 12, 1963, and thereafter as Judge of Corporation Court, City of Abilene, Texas, will conclude his services on September 17, 1965, to enter the private practice of law in Corpus Christi, Texas; and,
