<sup>with</sup> AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF FOUR (4) BUSES FOR THE USE OF THE CITY  
<sup>work.</sup> OF ABILENE, TEXAS.

WHEREAS, the City of Abilene duly advertised and gave such notice as re-  
quired by law for bids for the purchase of four (4) buses for the use of the City; and,  
WHEREAS, bids were received and opened on August 4, 1969, said bids  
being as follows:

GMC Truck & Coach Division	\$99,215.20
The Flexible Company	No Bid

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council that the bid of GMC Truck  
and Coach Division in the total amount of Ninety-Nine Thousand Two Hundred Fifteen  
and 20/100ths Dollars (\$99,215.20), is the lowest responsible bid and should be accept-  
ed; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE,  
TEXAS:

PART 1: That the bid of GMC Truck & Coach Division, for the purchase  
of four (4) buses, in the total amount of \$99,215.20, be, and the same is hereby in all  
things approved and accepted, contingent, however, upon the approval of an Urban  
Mass Transportation Grant, application for which is presently pending, from the  
Department of Housing and Urban Development to the City of Abilene in the amount  
of not less than two-thirds (2/3) of the purchase price of said buses.

PART 2: That the Purchasing Agent be, and he is hereby, subject to  
the above contingency, authorized to purchase four (4) buses from said firm.

PART 3: That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and  
after its passage.
