

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, ORDERING A RUNOFF ELECTION TO BE HELD IN SAID CITY ON MAY 1, 1984; PROVIDING FOR THE ELECTION OF A PERSON TO SERVE IN PLACE III ON THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE; DESIGNATING ELECTION PRECINCTS AND POLLING PLACES; APPOINTING VARIOUS ELECTION OFFICIALS AND FIXING THEIR RATE OF COMPENSATION; PROVIDING THAT SUCH ELECTION BE HELD PURSUANT TO THE LAWS OF THE STATE OF TEXAS AND CHARTER OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS; PROVIDING FOR BILINGUAL ELECTIONS; AND PROVIDING FOR A PROCLAMATION NOTICE AND PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF SAID ELECTIONS.

WHEREAS, it is now necessary to hold a runoff election in the City of Abilene, Texas, to elect a person to fill the position of Place III on the City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas; and,

WHEREAS, a regular city election for Mayor and Places III and IV was held on April 7, 1984; and,

WHEREAS, no candidate received a majority of the votes for Place III; and now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

PART 1: That a runoff election be, and the same is hereby ordered to be held within the jurisdictions of the City of Abilene, Texas, on the 1st day of May, 1984, pursuant to the laws of the State of Texas and the Charter of the City of Abilene, Texas. Such election shall be held to fill the position of Councilman Place III on the City Council of the City of Abilene, Texas.

The election ordered hereby shall be conducted as an at-large election. The candidate receiving a majority of the votes cast for this respective office shall be declared elected. Councilman Place III shall be filled by a person residing North of the present mainline of the Texas and Pacific Railway Company in the City of Abilene.

PART 2: The candidate elected to the city office stated hereinabove in Part 1 shall hold office as provided by the Charter of the City of Abilene, Texas.

PART 3: The City Council hereby provides that a runoff election shall be held for Place III and that the two (2) candidates who received the highest number of votes shall be voted on again by the qualified voters, and the candidate who

receives the majority of the votes for such office in the runoff election shall be elected to such office.

PART 4: The City Council hereby determines that the candidates Walter E. Wheat and Joel Loya received the highest number of votes for Councilman Place III and that said candidates shall be voted on again by the qualified voters in a runoff election, May 1, 1984.

PART 5: The candidate elected to the office of Councilman Place III shall hold office for a period of three (3) years from the first meeting of the City Council following their election or until their successor has been duly elected and qualified.

PART 6: The election called by this resolution shall be held in accordance with the requirements for bilingual elections as set forth in the Voting Rights Act amendments for 1975 (42 USC 1973aa-1a) and in Article 1.08a of the Election Code of the State of Texas. All election forms and material shall be printed in both English and Spanish, and bilingual oral assistance shall be made available within the requirements of the law.

PART 7: Said election shall be held in the election precincts, and voting shall be conducted at the polling places shown below:

The maximum number of clerks for each voting precinct shall be twelve (12), and each judge shall attempt to appoint one (1) clerk fluent both in English and Spanish.

The rate of compensation for all election judges and officials shall be Five and 00/100ths (\$5.00) Dollars, per hour; provided however, that each presiding judge or alternate presiding judge delivering returns of the election shall be paid an additional Twenty-Five and 00/100ths (\$25.00) Dollars, for that service.

PART 9: That the City Council of the City of Abilene hereby designates the system of marking or punching a ballot which is in such form that it may be counted by data processing machines as the approved method for tabulating votes in this Runoff Election

to be held on May 1, 1984. Said system having been previously approved and utilized by the Taylor County Commissioners for conducting their elections. The City Council further determines that all absentee ballots voted in person and by mail shall be voted by ballots to be counted by the electronic voting system. The Taylor County Courthouse is hereby designated as the Central Counting Station for the automatic counting and tabulating of ballots.

PART 10: That the Mayor shall make proclamation of said City election and give notice thereof, and a copy of this order shall be sufficient notice of said election. Notice of the time and places of holding said election shall be given by publication of such notice in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Abilene.

PART 11: That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage, as indicated below.
