

RESOLUTION NO. 34-1986

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, CALLING A CITY ELECTION.

WHEREAS, this City Council of said City deems it advisable to call the election hereinafter ordered; and,

WHEREAS, it is hereby officially found and determined that a case of emergency or urgent public necessity exists which requires the holding of the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted, such emergency or urgent public necessity being that the proceeds from the sale of the proposed bonds are required as soon as possible and without delay for necessary and urgently needed public improvements; and that said meeting was open to the public and public notice of the time, place and purpose of said meeting was given, all as required by Vernon's Ann. Civ. St. Article 6252-17; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

PART 1: That an election shall be held on the 23rd day of September, 1986, on the following set-out PROPOSITIONS in Part 6.

PART 2: The following persons are designated as Presiding Judges and Alternate Presiding Judges for their respective voting precincts:

The maximum number of clerks for each voting precinct shall be four (4), and each Judge shall attempt to appoint one (1) clerk fluent both in English and Spanish.

The rate of compensation shall be Five and 00/100ths Dollars (\$5.00) per hour; provided, however, that each Presiding Judge delivering returns of the election shall be paid an additional Twenty-five and 00/100ths Dollars (\$25.00) for that service.

The City Council further finds that absentee ballots shall be counted by the Absentee Ballot Board, as provided for by law.

PART 3: That by approving and signing this Resolution, the Mayor of said City officially confirms his appointment of the aforesaid election officers to serve at said election; and by passing this Resolution the governing body of said City approves and concurs in the appointment of the aforesaid election officers.

PART 4: That all resident, qualified electors of said City shall be entitled to vote at said election.

PART 5: That notice of said election shall be given by posting a substantial copy of this Resolution at the City Hall and in each of the election precincts in said City, not less than fifteen (15) days prior to the date set for said election; and a substantial copy of this Resolution also shall be published on the same day in each of two successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published in said City, the date of the

first publication to be not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date set for said election.

PART 6: That, at said election, the following PROPOSITIONS shall be submitted in accordance with law:

PROPOSITION NO. 1

Shall the City Council of said City be authorized to issue the bonds of said City, in one or more series or issues, in the aggregate principal amount of \$3,400,000 with the bonds of each such series or issue, respectively, to mature serially within not to exceed 40 years from their date, and to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council, for the purpose of acquiring, constructing, improving, and equipping the police station together with unified public safety communication center, and shall said City Council be authorized to levy and cause to be assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity?

PROPOSITION NO. 2

Shall the City Council of said City be authorized to issue the bonds of said City, in one or more series or issues, in the aggregate principal amount of \$1,050,000 with the bonds of each such series or issue, respectively, to mature serially within not to exceed 40 years from their date, and to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council, for the purpose of constructing and improving the flood control and drainage system for the City, and shall said City Council be authorized to levy and cause to be assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity?

PROPOSITION NO. 3

Shall the City Council of said City be authorized to issue the bonds of said City, in one or more series or issues, in the aggregate principal amount of \$750,000 with the bonds of each such series or issue, respectively, to mature serially within not to exceed 40 years from their date, and to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council, for the purpose of improving and renovating the City's zoo, and shall said City Council be authorized to levy and cause to be assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity?

PROPOSITION NO. 4

Shall the City Council of said City be authorized to issue the bonds of said City, in one or more series or issues, in the aggregate principal amount of \$370,000 with the bonds of each such series or issue, respectively, to mature serially within not to exceed 40 years from their date, and to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council, for the purpose of improving lands for park purposes, and shall said City Council be authorized to levy and cause to be assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity?

PROPOSITION NO. 5

Shall the City Council of said City be authorized to issue the bonds of said City, in one or more series or issues, in the aggregate principal amount of \$4,630,000 with the bonds of each such series or issue, respectively, to mature serially within not to exceed 40 years from their date, and to be sold at such prices and bear interest at such rates as shall be determined within the discretion of the City Council, for the purpose of constructing and improving the City's streets, bridges, and sidewalks, together with constructing and equipping a traffic control system, and shall said City Council be authorized to levy and cause to be assessed and collected annual ad valorem taxes in an amount sufficient to pay the annual interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund to pay said bonds at maturity?

PART 7: That the official ballots for said election shall be prepared in accordance with the Texas Election Code so as to permit the electors to vote "FOR" or "AGAINST" the aforesaid PROPOSITIONS, with the ballots to contain such provisions, markings and language as required by law, and with such PROPOSITIONS to be expressed substantially as follows:

Notice of the time and places of holding said election shall be given by publication of such notice in a newspaper of general circulation published in the City of Abilene at least thirty (30) days prior to the day of such election.

PART 9: That this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage, as indicated below.
