

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR APPROVAL OF APPLICATION FOR GRANT FUNDS FROM THE CRIMINAL JUSTICE DIVISION, VICTIMS OF CRIME ACT (VOCA) FUND, TO FURTHER DEVELOP THE ABILENE/TAYLOR COUNTY CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER.

WHEREAS, the VOCA Crime Victim Assistance program provides funds to projects with a primary mission of providing direct services to victims of crime; and,

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Abilene finds it in the best interest of citizens of Taylor and surrounding counties (Scurry, Mitchell, Nolan, Fisher, Jones, Eastland and Callahan) that the position of Intake/Volunteer Recruiter Coordinator be funded and administered through the Abilene/Taylor County Child Advocacy Center; and,

WHEREAS, the City of Abilene has agreed to support this operation extension of the Abilene/Taylor County Child Advocacy Center, and the City of Abilene has agreed to receive \$32,400 and provide match monies and in-kind monies of \$8,121, or an equal to one-fifth of the total project cost, as required by the grant application; and,


WHEREAS, the City of Abilene has agreed that in the event of loss or misuse of the Criminal Justice Division funds, the City of Abilene assures that the funds will be returned to the Criminal Justice Division in full.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, that:

- Part 1. The City hereby approves the submission of a grant application for expanding services of the Abilene/Taylor County Child Advocacy Center.
- Part 2. The City will administer these funds only for expansion of the Abilene/Taylor County Child Advocacy Center.
- Part 3. The Chief of Police is authorized to sign the grant contract on behalf of the City of Abilene.
- Part 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.


