

RESOLUTION NO. 244-2024

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS TO APPROVAL TO PURCHASE 21 ADDITIONAL WATCHGUARD SYSTEMS, WARRANTY SERVICES, AND STORAGE SERVICES FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT FROM MOTOROLA SOLUTIONS.

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Abilene recognizes the need for WatchGuard hardware, services and storage from Motorola Solutions; and

WHEREAS, the Information Technology Department will require hardware, services and storage to support the fiscal year 2025 implementation of WatchGuard technologies for the Police Department's vehicles; and

WHEREAS, the Information Technology Department, in association with replacing the Abilene Police Department's Mobile Data Computer (MDC) systems, requires this new wireless video recording hardware and services to be acquired in Fiscal Year 2025 as provided for as budgeted and funded through the Abilene Police Department's Apparatus fund; and

WHEREAS, this is the first of a three-year initiative to increase the Police Department fleet of police vehicles and achieve a one-to-one assignment to officers; and

WHEREAS, that total fiscal year 2025 hardware, services and storage is not to exceed \$258,514.20 and

WHEREAS, this acquisition will be from Motorola Solutions as a provider of WatchGuard hardware, services and storage through the Texas State Contract #DIR-TSO- 4101; and

WHEREAS, it is the staff's recommendation that the City Council endorses the Information Technology Department's acquisition of this hardware, services and storage from Motorola Solutions; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

Part 1: That the City Council approves the acquisition of hardware, services and storage from Motorola Solutions for a not to exceed amount of \$258,514.20 in fiscal year 2025

Part 2: That this Resolution shall take effect immediately from and after passage.
