

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN PROPERTY ADJOINING
MCMURRY COLLEGE TO THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE
CITY OF ABILENE:

Section One: That whereas the owners of the property hereinafter described lying adjacent to the corporate limits of The City of Abilene, Texas, have petitioned the Board of Commissioners of said City of Abilene, requesting that said property be made a part of the corporate limits of said City, said property being described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at the present City limits and at the S.E. Corner of McMurry College Campus; thence east 130 feet to the west line of McMurry Park Addition to The City of Abilene, Texas; thence north with the west boundary line of McMurry Park Addition crossing S.14th Street to the intersection of the north line of S.14th Street with the east line of Sayles Boulevard, or being the S.W. Cor. of the S.78 feet of the west 156 feet of Lot No.8 in Block No.5, Benjamin Austin ~~Survey~~ Addition to Abilene, Texas; thence west 130 feet to the S.E. Cor. of Block 39, the second continuation of the Highland Addition to The City of Abilene, Texas; thence south crossing S.14th Street along the E.B. U. of McMurry Campus to the place of beginning, all being in Taylor County, Texas.

Section Two: That the above described property according to the metes and bounds as set forth, be and the same is hereby declared annexed to The City of Abilene, Texas and the same is hereby declared to be an integral part of said City and incorporated within the corporate limits thereof.

Section Three: That the Corporate Limits of The City of Abilene, Texas be and the same is hereby extended to include the above described property.

Section Four: The fact that the property hereinabove described is so closely annexed to McMurry College that it is a civic part thereof; and the further fact that it is the wish of the governing body to lend every possible assistance to McMurry College as well as all the other institutions of higher learning within its borders; and the further fact that school is in session at McMurry and all the other colleges and the particular portion of property hereinabove described is greatly in need of immediate civic development, creates an emergency requiring that the common practice and rule of reading ordinances at two separate and distinct regular meetings and passing same at two such meetings of the Board of Commissioners be suspended as authorized by Section 32 of the Charter, and such rule is hereby suspended by a vote of three commissioners and the Mayor and the ordinance read and passed twice at the same regular meeting.

Section Five: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
