AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTIONS 5, 8 and 9 OF AN ORDINANCE PASSED ON THE 17th DAY OF AUGUST, 1901, ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH AND REGULATE A PUBLIC POUND AND TO REGULATE AND RESTRAIN AND PROHIBIT THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF HORSES, CATTLE, SHEEP, SWINE, GOATS, JACKS, JERSEYS AND TO AUTHORIZE THE DISTRAINING, IMPOUNDING AND SALE OF SAME FOR THE COSTS OF THE PROCEEDINGS AND THE PENALTY INCURRED"

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ABILENE:

That Sections 5, 8 and 9 of an Ordinance finally passed by the City Council of the City of Abilene on August 17, 1901 and approved by the Mayor August 21, 1901, bearing the caption as set out in the caption to this Ordinance and recorded in old Ordinance Book No. 2, Pages 250 - 254, be amended to read as follows:

Section 5: That on the day and at the place specified in the notice herein provided for, unless said animals have been before claimed by the owners thereof, the Stock Policeman shall sell the same at the City Live Stock Pound in the City of Abilene between the hours of 10 o'clock A.M. and 4 o'clock P.M., at public auction to the highest bidders for cash; and the proceeds of such sale shall be paid to the City Treasurer to the credit of the Impounding Fund.

Section 8: The Stock Policeman shall collect from the owner of the impounded animals, before delivering the same, a fee of One Dollar per head for the first impounding and Two Dollars per head for any subsequent impounding of the same animals, and in addition thereto the expense of feeding and caring for said animals, and ten cents per head for advertising, which sums shall be paid to the City Treasurer.

Section 9: The Chief of Police shall select a Stock Policeman who shall perform the duties of stock policeman prescribed in this Ordinance.

Otherwise said Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Passed on its first reading on this, the 31st day of December, A. D., 1943.

Passed on its second and final reading on this, the 7 day of January, A. D., 1944.
