

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE PASSED ON THE 17th DAY OF AUGUST, 1901, ENTITLED: "AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH AND REGULATE A PUBLIC POUND AND TO REGULATE AND RESTRAIN AND PROHIBIT THE RUNNING AT LARGE OF HORSES, CATTLE, SHEEP, SWINE, GOATS, JACKS, JENNETS AND TO AUTHORIZE THE DISTRAINING, IMPOUNDING AND SALE OF SAME FOR THE COSTS OF THE PROCEEDINGS AND THE PENALTY INCURRED"; BY ADDING THERETO SECTION 1a.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE

CITY OF ABILENE:

That Sections ~~5, 8 and 9~~ of an Ordinance finally passed by the City Council of the City of Abilene on August 17, 1901, and approved by the Mayor August 21, 1901, bearing the caption as set out in the caption to this Ordinance, and recorded in old Ordinance Book No. 2, Pages 252 - 254, which was amended by an Ordinance passed on January 7, 1944 by adding thereto Sections No. 5, 8 and 9, being Ordinance No. 169, Book 4, Page 174, be further amended by adding thereto Section 1a, to read as follows, to wit:

"Section 1a. The owner, keeper or person who has charge of any horse, mule, cattle, sheep, swine, goats, jacks or jennets, who shall knowingly permit, or carelessly or negligently permit such animal to run at large within the corporate limits of the City of Abilene, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall, on conviction, be punished by a fine of not less than five nor more than two hundred dollars, and each day that he shall so permit such animal to run at large in said city shall be deemed a separate offense."

Otherwise said Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

Passed on its first reading on this, the 1 day of March, A. D., 1944.

Passed on its second reading on this, the 10 day of March, A. D., 1944.
