

ORDINANCE NO. 438

AN ORDINANCE DEDICATING CERTAIN PROPERTY TO THE PUBLIC FOR STREET PURPOSES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ABILENE:

SECTION 1. That the hereinafter described property which belongs to the City of Abilene be and the same is hereby dedicated to the public to be used for street purposes, said property described as follows:

A portion of North Nineteenth Street which has heretofore been closed by ordinance and a small tract out of the southwest corner of Block 25, Sears Park Addition to the City of Abilene, Taylor County, Texas, the tract hereby dedicated being described by metes and bounds as follows:

BEGINNING at a point in the Northwest corner of Block R, Crescent Heights Addition to the City of Abilene, also the beginning of a curve to the left whose radius is 224.0 feet, and whose tangent is 40 feet long and on a North prolongation of the West line of said Block R;

THENCE around said curve to the left across North 19th Street (closed by Ordinance) to the end of the curve;

THENCE North 20 degrees 15' West 5.3' to the beginning of a curve to the right;

THENCE around said curve to the right whose radius is 224.0 feet to the end of said curve where it becomes tangent to the West line of Block 25, Sears Addition to the City of Abilene, said point being 100.0 feet North of the Southwest corner of said block;

THENCE South along the West line of said Block 25, Sears Addition to the Southwest corner of said Block 25;

THENCE South 26 degrees 11' East across North 19th Street (closed by Ordinance) 68.6' to the place of beginning, containing 0.035 acres, more or less.

SECTION 2. Upon final passage hereof, the City Engineer is hereby directed to utilize said property as a part of the public street system of the City of Abilene and to amend the official maps of the City in accordance herewith.

PASSED ON FIRST READING this the ~~24th~~ day of September, A. D. 1951.

After said passage a notice of the time and place when and where said ordinance would be read and considered for final passage was published in the Abilene Reporter-News, a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Abilene, said publication being on the 24th day of September, A. D. 1951 at least one week prior to the time advertised. After such opportunity for the public to be heard, said ordinance was passed on its second and final reading on the 6th day of October, A. D. 1951.
