

ORDINANCE #752

AN ORDINANCE VACATING, ABANDONING, AND CLOSING SOUTH 16TH STREET FROM BUTTERNUT STREET TO BELMONT BLVD.; AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE QUIT CLAIM DEEDS TO THE ABUTTING PROPERTY OWNERS.

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Board of the City of Abilene, at its meeting on September 10, 1956 recommended that South 16th Street be closed from Butternut Street to Belmont Blvd., NOW THEREFORE;

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

Section 1: That South 16th Street from Butternut Street to Belmont Blvd. be and the same is hereby abandoned as a public street of the City of Abilene.

Section 2: That upon passage hereof, Mayor C. E. Gatlin, be and he is hereby authorized to execute proper instruments quit-claiming any interest, with the exception of utility easements to be reserved by the City, which the City of Abilene may have in said street to the abutting property owners.

Section 3: That the City Engineer be, and he is hereby directed to amend the official maps of the City of Abilene, showing the change hereby ordered.

PASSED on first reading, this the 21st day of September, 1956.

After said passage a notice of time and place where and when said ordinance would be given a public hearing and considered for final passage was published in the Abilene Reporter News, a daily newspaper of general circulation in the City of Abilene, said publication being on the 19th day of September, 1956, the same being more than one week prior to the time designated for said hearing. After such opportunity for the public to be heard, said ordinance was passed on its second and final reading on the 5th day of October, 1956.
