ORDINANCE NO. 21

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 20 OF CHAPTER 32 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, 1957, AS AMENDED, BY PROVIDING FOR THE PROHIBITION OF OVER-NIGHT RECREATIONAL USES OF LAKE ABILENE AND LAKE KIRBY AND SURROUNDING LAND, BELONGING TO THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS, AND PROVIDING A PENALTY.

WHEREAS, Lake Abilene and Lake Kirby are integral parts of the City of Abilene water supply system; and,

WHEREAS, both of said lakes, are small in size and recreational uses must be closely supervised in order to protect the quality of said water supply; and,

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council that said water supply can best be safeguarded by the prohibition of over-night recreational uses; now, therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

Section 1: That Section 20 of Chapter 32 of The Code of The City of Abilene, Texas, 1957, as amended, be, and the same is hereby, further amended so as to hereafter read as follows:

"Sec. 32-20: It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to fish, camp, bathe, swim, water-ski, or in any other manner use either Lake Abilene or Lake Kirby and/or surrounding land belonging to

~~the City of Abilene for recreational purposes, between sunset of one~~

Section 2. Any person, firm, association or corporation violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in any sum not to exceed ~~Two Hundred Dollars~~ Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), and each offense and each day of continuance or failure to comply with the provisions of this ordinance, shall constitute a separate offense.

Ordinance is hereby

and said rule is hereby suspended and this ordinance shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage.
