ORDINANCE NO. 21-1999

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 23, "PLANNING AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT," SUBPART E, "ZONING," OF THE ABILENE MUNICIPAL CODE, BY AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS AS SET OUT BELOW; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; DECLARING A PENALTY AND CALLING A PUBLIC HEARING.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ABILENE, TEXAS:

- PART 1: That Chapter 23, Subpart E, "Zoning," of the Abilene Municipal Code be amended as set out in Exhibit "A," attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance for all purposes.
- PART 2: That if any provision or any section of this ordinance shall be held to be void or unconstitutional, such holding shall in no way affect the validity of the remaining provisions or sections of this ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect.
- PART 3: That any person, firm or corporation violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00). Each day such violation shall continue or be permitted to continue, shall be deemed a separate offense.

EXHIBIT "A"

Amend Section 23-317.3. <u>ACCESSORY BUILDINGS</u>
<u>Use and Area Requirements</u>

DELETE: C.(1)(a) and (b)

ADD: C.(1)

Single Family Residential (RS and MH) Districts
An accessory building in an RS or MH district
shall be used only for such activities that are
incidental and consistent with the primary use of
the land but in no circumstance shall be used for
residential living purposes. An accessory
building in an RS or MH district shall not be
equipped with a stove or any kitchen facilities.
An accessory building may have one bathroom not to
exceed 36 square feet in area, or the minimum size
necessary if designed for handicap accessibility.
